Background



- Metro Health began utilizing the Triple P – Positive Parenting Program as a child abuse prevention initiative in 2019.
- Triple P is an evidence-based program that has been shown to reduce child abuse rates when implemented on a population-level.
- Child abuse is a significant issue locally and has damaging long-term effects on the victim, family, and community.

Background



- The amendment will increase access to positive parenting training for practitioners and provide parents/caregivers access to self-paced virtual parenting classes.
- Triple P America will continue to provide:
 - Special certification opportunities for existing practitioners
 - Training for new practitioners in:
 - Seminars for parents of young children
 - Comprehensive small group series for expecting parents and parents of infants, pre-teens and teenagers
 - Modules on anger management and emotional regulation in parenting context
 - Access codes for Triple P Online, the comprehensive, self-paced, virtual parenting course, based on the child's stage of development
- **All classes are offered at no cost to parents, caregivers, and practitioners.**

Fiscal Impact



- Amendment to the agreement with Triple P America, Inc.:
 - Initial Term: October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024
 - Initial Amount: \$116,735.00
 - Amended Term: October 1, 2023 through March 31, 2025.
 - Increased Amount: \$90,758.08
 - Total Amount: \$207,493.08
 - Funding in the amount of \$90,758.08 is from Metro Health's General Fund FY25 Adopted Budget.
