Purpose

The SAFD Mobile Integrated Healthcare program would like to renew this donation for the Program for Intensive Care Coordination. This program's goal is to reduce the utilization of Emergency Detention, therefore reducing the consumption of the Psychiatric ERs & Psychiatric Emergency Service beds. Thus, impacting the overall Healthcare System by better consumer care coordination post Emergency Detention and to develop joint agency data integration.



Overview

There is an annual average of 8,800 emergency detentions (ED's) performed by the San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) that are routed to local hospitals utilizing STRAC's law enforcement navigation system. Within the 8,800 ED's, are subsets of clients who have been emergency detained six or more times in the last 6 months or three times in the last month. These clients are considered high volume utilizers and create a burden on the local hospitals systems since these clients tie up beds and resources for up to 72 hours.



Plan of Action



The PICC team utilizes two (2) MIH paramedics to work side by side with SAPD Mental Health Officers and Local Mental Health Authority -Center Health Care Services (CHCS) personnel to connect with individual's pre and post mental health crisis and Emergency Detention.

PICC was launched in July 2019

8,820 PICC Contacts were conducted in 2023



Recommendations

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance to accept the contribution up to \$319,774 from the Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council for Trauma (STRAC)





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
