Background



- Metro Health's Oral Health Program provides:
 - Preventive care to nearly 20,000 children annually
 - Dental case management, assisting participating families in accessing and establishing routine dental care to include treatment for untreated tooth decay.

Background



- The Title V Maternal and Child Health Block Grant Dental Services Program serves low-income children six months to 17 years of age that do not qualify for Medicaid or CHIP and do not have the means of accessing quality dental care.
- Metro Health contracts with the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio (UT Health) to connect children to diagnostic, preventive, and restorative dental care services.
- The Title V program, in collaboration with UT Health, provides services to more than 600 children annually in San Antonio and Bexar County.

Fiscal Impact



- Agreement with UT Health:
 - Term: September 1, 2024, through August 31, 2025
 - Three, one-year renewal options
 - Initial term amount: \$225,580
 - Renewal term amount: \$160,000 each
 - Total amount: \$705,580
