

**AN ORDINANCE**

**AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMET TO A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH URBAN-15 GROUP FOR AN ADDITIONAL \$39,240 FOR A TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$164,240 TO ADD THE BARBARA “ROBBIE” ROBINETTE SENIOR CENTER TO THE LIST OF CENTERS RECEIVING SERVICES FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE CONTRACT TERM THROUGH MARCH 31, 2029. FUNDING FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR IS CONTINGENT UPON CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL OF THE ANNUAL BUDGETS AND FUNDS.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of San Antonio’s Department of Human Services (DHS) operates 12 Comprehensive Senior Centers and 6 part-time senior center sites that offer programs to assist older adults aged 60 and over to lead healthy, active, and engaged lives; and

**WHEREAS**, the current 5-year contract with Urban-15 Group provides culturally based music and dance classes at 4 senior centers from April 1, 2024 to March 30, 2029 pursuant to Ordinance No. 2025-03-20-0200; and

**WHEREAS**, a new senior center was built in District 4 and the parties wish to amend the contract’s Scope of Work and add additional funding; **NOW THEREFORE:**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:**

**SECTION 1.** The execution of an amendment to a contract with URBAN-15 GROUP to add additional funding and services for a newly-built Barbara “Robbie” Robinette Senior Center in the amount of \$39,240, is approved. A copy of the amendment in substantially final form is attached and incorporated here for all purposes as **Attachment I**.

**SECTION 2.** Funding in the amount of \$9,810 for this ordinance is available in Fund 11001000, Cost Center 3806020201 and General Ledger 5202020 as part of the Fiscal Year 2024 Adopted Budget approved by City Council.

**SECTION 3.** Additional funding in the amount of \$29,430.00 for this ordinance is contingent upon City Council approval of the Fiscal Year 2025 and subsequent years’ budgets that fall within the contract length.

**SECTION 4.** Payment in the amount up to \$39,240 is authorized to URBAN-15 GROUP for the amendment and should be encumbered with a purchase order.

**SECTION 5.** The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager’s designee, correct allocations to specific

Cost Centers, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, General Ledger Accounts, and Fund Numbers as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 6.** This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.

# ATTACHMENT I

**AMENDMENT #1 TO THE  
PROFESSIONAL SERVICE CONTRACT  
BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND  
THE URBAN-15 GROUP**

This amendment ( “Amendment”) of the URBAN-15 GROUP Professional Service Contract (“Contract”) is entered into between the City of San Antonio (“City”), a Texas Municipal Corporation acting by and through its City Manager, and the URBAN-15 Group ( “Contractor”), by its authorized director.

**WHEREAS**, the Contract was approved pursuant to Ordinance No. 2024-03-21-0200 to promote the wellbeing and independence of seniors age 60 and older at four (4) of the City’s senior centers; and

**WHEREAS**, a new senior center was built in District 4 (the “Barbara ‘Robbie’ Robinnette Center”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Parties desire amend the Contract’s Scope of Work to expand service delivery to this fifth center; **NOW THEREFORE**:

City and Contractor agree to amend the Contract as follows:

1. The total amount in Section 3.1 of the Contract is amended to state:  
In consideration of CONSULTANT’s performance in a satisfactory and efficient manner, as determined solely by Director, of all services and activities set forth in this CONTRACT, CITY agrees to pay CONSULTANT a total amount not to exceed **\$164,240.00**, to be paid to CONSULTANT in amounts not to exceed the Cost per Class identified in Attachment A and according to the Schedule identified therein. The Parties may alter the Schedule in Attachment A in writing without needing to execute an Amendment according to this CONTRACT.
2. The document attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit I reflects agreed upon revisions to Attachment A, the Statement of Services here retitled the Scope of Work. The revisions supersede prior conflicting or inconsistent agreements with regard to the referenced Attachment II, and all references in the Contract to Attachment II shall be retitled and mean the Scope of Work as revised by this Amendment.
3. All other terms, conditions, and provisions of the Contract are hereby continued and shall remain in effect in their original form, except those modified by this Amendment.


