Union Pacific Railroad Maintenance Agreement

SUMMARY:

On February 1, 2024, Councilmember Jalen McKee-Rodriguez issued a Council Consideration Request (CCR) requesting to formalize a partnership between the City of San Antonio and Union Pacific Railroad to address maintenance of properties owned by Union Pacific to better address illegal dumping, code enforcement, and other miscellaneous issues.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Public Works routinely enters into construction agreements with Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) on construction projects within or near its right-of-way. However, these agreements only address specific construction projects adjacent to UPRR's right-of-way. UPRR performs all work within UPRR's right-of-way. Public Works has no existing agreement with UPRR regarding the maintenance within UPRR properties.

UPRR routinely maintains its railroad crossings and equipment. For safety reasons, Public Works or any other City department does not enter into a UPRR right-of-way unless granted permission from UPRR. The Union Pacific Maintenance Agreement, as described in the CCR, requests that Union Pacific Railroad enter into a partnership to address the maintenance of properties owned by UPRR and better address illegal dumping, code enforcement, and other miscellaneous issues.

ISSUE:

The Public Works Department is currently in the process of exploring the potential of an agreement and partnership between the City of San Antonio and Union Pacific Railroad Company to address maintenance of Union Pacific Railroad properties and better address illegal dumping, code enforcement, and other miscellaneous issues. Staff's presentation will include a status of what has been currently done.
