Job Order Contract (JOC) Program



Purpose

- JOCs are used by multiple City departments as an alternative project delivery method related to City facilities for:
 - Construction
 - Renovation
 - Rehabilitation
 - Maintenance

Used by City Departments:

- Building & Equipment Services
- Center City Development
- Convention & Sports Facilities
- Library
- Parks & Recreation
- Pre-K 4 SA
- Fire Department
- Police Department

JOC Task Orders



Assignment

Task Orders are assigned to a JOC based on the evaluation of the following criteria:

- Client requirements
- Contractor availability and capacity
- Previous work experience with client, site and/or project scope
- Specific trade experience

Key Benefits

- ✓ Streamlined process
- ✓ Expedites delivery of construction and repairs
- ✓ Quality of work
- ✓ Requires minimum design
- ✓ Promotes use of local contractors and subcontractors




Current Challenges

- Over \$95 million has been allocated to JOC contracts.
- Anticipating to exceed \$96 million spending capacity before the end of the contracting term (March 2025).
- Seven (7) months remain in the program.

Recommendations

Authorizing an **Amendment** to the Job Order Contract Program to:

- **Increase the Job Order Contract Program Spending Capacity** by \$24 million to total \$120 million.
- **Authorize the Use of the Remaining Program Spending** to be administered amongst the Job Order Contractors
