


The Government Affairs Department advocates on behalf of San Antonio residents to secure the authority and resources needed to deliver quality services.

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Initiatives

East-West Business Corridor

Support development of an East-West roadway across the southern region of San Antonio providing access to major manufacturing employers.



East-West Corridor

Infrastructure improvements are needed to enhance access and connectivity for major employers, commercial and manufacturing businesses to the rest of the city and the state's highway system.

- The south side of San Antonio has seen an incredible amount of growth and investments.
- In the next four years, there will be at least 2,000 more jobs in the area.
- The business, residential, and job growth in the area is attracting significant retail into south San Antonio. Restaurants, retail and many other establishments have opened locations in the South Side.



Protection of Community Interests

The City's overarching legislative priority is to preserve the voice of the community - as expressed through the city charter and other voter approved amendments - and maintain a fiscally sound and well-managed organization to allow for continued high quality services to our residents and local businesses.

Support legislation that maintains the authority of local elected officials to create new ordinances and protect the existing ones.



Oppose legislation that would be detrimental to the City's interests and results in the loss of revenue or negatively impacts the authority to generate revenues.



Oppose legislation that would erode municipal authority to enforce development-related regulations.



Oppose legislation that is discriminatory and undermines the City's Non-Discrimination Ordinance.


