

**RFCA #23-194927**

**SECTION 1.** The City Manager or designee, or the Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) or designee, is hereby authorized to apply for and accept funds in an amount up to \$3,149,752.00 from the Office of the Governor, Homeland Security Grants Division for the 2024 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program for a grant period beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2024. A copy of said application is on file with the San Antonio Office of Emergency Management.

**SECTION 2.** The City Manager or designee, or the Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) or designee, is further authorized to execute any and all necessary documents to effectuate said application and acceptance. In the event of loss or misuse of the UASI funds, the City assures that the funds will be returned to the Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) in full.

**SECTION 3.** Upon acceptance of this award, a new fund and internal order number will be created, upon which the sum not to exceed \$3,149,752.00 will be appropriated from the Office of the Governor, Homeland Security Grants Division. A final and formal budget, which will include Internal Order numbers and General Ledger numbers, will be submitted by the department upon award.

**SECTION 4.** The personnel complement of three (3) positions, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment VII**, is approved.

**SECTION 5.** The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 6.** This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
