DIRECTOR'S REPORT



The world of animal sheltering is often plagued with misconceptions. Some of these are by our own making, to be sure, but just as many by presumably good-hearted people who are just misinformed about all the roles animal shelters support in their communities.

This is especially true when it comes to municipal animal agencies. That's why I'm so excited to bring you this quarter's advisory board report. Of course, the report includes the Animal Care Services metrics for the fiscal year's third quarter. But it also highlights the myriad of novel ways Animal Care supports humane pet care and public safety throughout San Antonio.

Take the recently held Big Fix, an annual mega-pet sterilization event hosted by our partner at Spay Neuter Inject Protect San Antonio

(SNIPSA). The MASH-style clinic uses a military hospital approach to sterilize as many dogs and cats as possible in a single day. Close to 500 S.A. pets were spayed or neutered at the event held in late March, an effort made possible by a positive partnership between SNIPSA, Animal Care Services, District 4 Councilwoman Dr. Adriana Rocha-Garcia and our gracious hosts at Port San Antonio.

Collaboration in support of the community is also behind two other stories you'll read about in these pages. In February, ACS marked National Act of Kindness Day with a pet food giveaway that benefited 300 local pet parents. Partnering with Chewy.com and the Humane Society of the United States, the department was able to distribute more than 17 TONS of pet food and supplies. Plans are underway

for another pet food distribution in the late Spring.

The month of love also saw the launch of another positive partnership; this time to address the difficulty many pet guardians have with ready access to spay neuter resources. Working with Spay Neuter Network, Petco Love and the San Antonio Area Foundation, the City is supporting a new program that offers neighborhood-based transportation for spay/neuter appointments at the SNN clinic.

These latest efforts show the real value in moving conversation to collaboration to address pet related issues in the Alamo City. Rest assured, Animal Care Services has more on the horizon and we're always ready to work with solution finders.

Spay Neuter Network Launches Transportation Program

Launched this past February, the latest collaboration with the Spay Neuter Network, aimed at enhancing accessibility to pet care services began! This partnership introduces the Spay Neuter Network transportation program, in collaboration with Petco Love and the San Antonio Area Foundation.

The program offers a solution for pet guardians with limited transportation, enabling them to conveniently access sterilization services for their furry companions. Pet guardians can

reserve transportation for their pets from a designated central location in their area to the Spay Neuter Network clinic for surgery. Following the procedure, pets will be safely transported back to the pickup location.

A Texas-sized thank you to ACS rescue partner, Winding Branch Ranch

In response to a neglect call last month, ACS Officer Weiss encountered a distressing scene, wherein two horses were found tethered under dire circumstances.

A stallion was found tethered to a utility trailer, while a mare was tied to the front fence line, both bearing the physical toll of neglect and adversity. Recognizing the urgent need for assistance, it became evident that the horses lacked proper shelter and basic care. Following discussions with the homeowners regarding the situation, the family relinquished custody of the horses to the shelter's care.

The shelter's partnership with Winding Branch Ranch proved instrumental in providing a lifeline to these resilient animals. Under the nurturing care of Winding Branch Ranch, the horses now have the opportunity to thrive, experiencing the love, attention, and happiness they deserve.

SECOND QUARTER PERFORMANCE



Annual Fiscal Year 2024 targets are displayed to gauge the actual performance of each metric during the course of the recent fiscal year.

SUPPORT THE PLACEMENT OF PETS FOR LIFE

In FY 2017, Animal Care Services (ACS) hit and maintained an annual Live-Release rate of 90+% for several years. While this is a monumental achievement, ACS - like open-admission shelters across the country - has faced severe challenges over the past couple years. This is why the Placement Division is constantly developing new programs and enhancing existing programs. Some of the ways in which ACS is pushing raise the Live Release rate include: Free dog training for adopters to help ensure successful outcomes; Building partnerships with external agencies to take part in national events and grant opportunities; Continuing to support and be supported by committed rescue partners.



LIVE RELEASE RATE




CONTROLLING THE ROAMING ANIMAL POPULATION

Animal Care Services (ACS) strategic goal to control the animal population includes any program that reduces or manages the stray animal population. Spay and neuter surgeries performed in-house and by ACS partners help contribute to this strategic priority, as does microchipping, which allows ACS to reunite roaming pets with their owners, often without needing to bring the animal to the ACS campus. In addition, the metric of dead animal pickup is used as an additional indicator of the number of animals roaming free.




PETS RETURNED TO OWNER-FIELD





CITATIONS WRITTEN




SERIOUS BODILY INJURIES






FOSTER POSITIVE CONNECTIONS WITH OUR COMMUNITY


