Lea LaPort, Laura Linam, Kirstin Nickell, John Bachman, and Veronica Saldate spoke regarding animal rights noting the recent unprovoked shooting of innocent dogs and linked animal cruelty to domestic violence and child abuse. They both requested investigations by SAPD and called for the City to move to no-kill status and better service by Animal Care Services.

Kirsten Nickell spoke in opposition to sending wastewater down Helotes Creek.

Veronica Saldate spoke in opposition to horse-drawn carriages.

Antonio Diaz announced the annual Indigenous People's Day March to be held on October 12, 2024 and requested that the government recognize the rights of indigenous people.

Joshua Hinson spoke in opposition to his arrest and tickets related to sidewalk chalk artwork.
