Multimodal Transportation Commission

SUMMARY:

Proposed creation of the Multimodal Transportation Commission.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On January 30, 2025, City Council adopted the Bike Network Plan. With the adoption, City Council also approved the requirement of creating a Transportation Commission that would provide input and recommendations to City Council on policies and other issues affecting pedestrians and bicyclists.

In addition to the Bike Network Plan, City Council also adopted the 2024 Complete Streets Policy and the 2024 update to the Vision Zero Action Plan in September 2024, and recently adopted the Transit-Oriented Policy Framework in December 2024. All of these policies recommended a

committee to provide input and recommendations for policies and other implementation steps.

The recommended commission composition would include council district representation and “at large” members that represent organizations and agencies for a total of 13 members.

In appointing members of the commission, the City Council shall make appointments that are sensitive to the goals of the city for a safe, connected, multimodal transportation network. It is recommended that representation include the proposed number of representatives within these categories with the following backgrounds:

- 3 - Transit Riders
- 3 - Cyclists
- 1 - Traffic Engineer

For the remaining number of appointments, consideration can be given to members with backgrounds representing or working in the following areas:

- Affordable Housing
- Children
- Development Community
- Disabled
- Environment
- Health & Quality of Life
- Non-Motorists
- Older Adults
- Urban Planning
