- The CDC launched the national Ending the HIV Epidemic Initiative to reduce new HIV infections in the United States by 90% by 2030.




Priority Populations

Background



- The CDC aims to scale up key prevention and treatment strategies in 57 priority jurisdictions, including San Antonio.
- Contracted agencies will provide:
 - Culturally relevant sexual health information, targeting vulnerable populations
 - Outreach and engagement, HIV testing, and social service navigation

Fiscal Impact



- Agreements with each contractor:
 - Term: Upon execution through May 31, 2025
 - Four, one-year renewal options
 - Initial term amount per agreement: up to \$37,554.00
 - Renewal amount per agreement: up to \$45,060.00
 - Total initial term amount: \$187,770.00
 - Total cumulative amount: \$1,088,970.00, inclusive of renewals
 - Funding is available from the Ending the HIV Epidemic grant
