**SUBJECT:**

Consideration of five (5) At-Large appointments to the Planning Commission.

**SUMMARY:**

The Governance Committee will review and consider applicants for five (5) At-Large board seats to the Planning Commission. Appointees will serve the remainder of an unexpired term ending October 6, 2026.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The Planning Commission comprises nine (9) At-Large members appointed by the City Council, the City Manager (Ex-Officio), a City Councilmember (Ex-Officio), the Zoning Commission Chair, and the Zoning Board of Adjustment Chair. The City Council-appointed Commissioners serve for overlapping two-year terms and should represent as nearly as practicable the various Districts of the City. The terms of five (5) of the City Council appointees have expired, and they are currently serving in holdover status.

Councilmember Phyllis Viagran (Council District 3) submitted Council Consideration Request (CCR) 2024-0019 calling for the diversification of the Planning Commission. In response to this CCR, a concerted effort was made to recruit applicants from all the City's Districts. These efforts began on December 3, 2024, and ran through December 31, 2024, with the announcement of the search for new commissioners made through digital and physical media including posts on the City's website and social media accounts; mass emails; Citywide text notices; and flyers provided to registered neighborhood associations, community organizations, senior centers, libraries, and City Council District offices.

At the end of the application period, a total of 29 applications were received. Mayor Nirenberg appointed Governance Committee members Councilmembers Rocha Garcia and Cabello Havrda to an ad-hoc review committee to review all applications and establish a shortlist of candidates for consideration by the full Committee.

Dr. Dessouky is a professor in the division of Civil and Environmental Engineering and assistant director of school of Civil and Environmental Engineering and Construction Management. He has more than 20 years of experience in roadways sustainability, maintenance, pavement management and traffic safety. Prior to his arrival to UTSA, he participated in several state and national projects during the employment at Texas A&M University, University of Illinois, and Washington State University. His current research projects are sponsored by federal, state and private sector. His funding at UTSA exceeds \$12 million from FHWA, USDOT, TxDOT, City of San Antonio, CPS energy, SARA, Howlett Packard, Institute of International Education and SWRI.

Dr. Dessouky is a current panelist and reviewer for the NCHRP program, Air Force Faculty Fellowship Program, Fulbright, and NASA graduate fellowship program. He has 126 refereed technical publications in peer-reviewed journals on bituminous materials, computational micromechanics of asphalt mixtures, pavement sustainability, geogrid reinforcement, energy harvesting from roadways and motorists safety. SARA has been working with the development community to predict growth patterns and has been busy upgrading their treatment plants in anticipation of the future development in the area. This process will take some time and even once the treatment capacity exists, the main infrastructure to convey the wastewater to the treatment plants will still need to be created. This will largely fall on developers to do as their projects are planned and brought to fruition. As in the other areas of San Antonio, this will require the extension of water and sewer mains to the project location. Additionally, the need to build out the transportation infrastructure will cause the creation of PIDS to allow for reimbursement of these expensive infrastructure extensions. All these costs get passed on to the end user, which negatively impacts the cost of housing and commercial land.
