City Payment Base Budget

CPS revenues in excess of 10% of City payment base budget allocated to the following as determined by the City

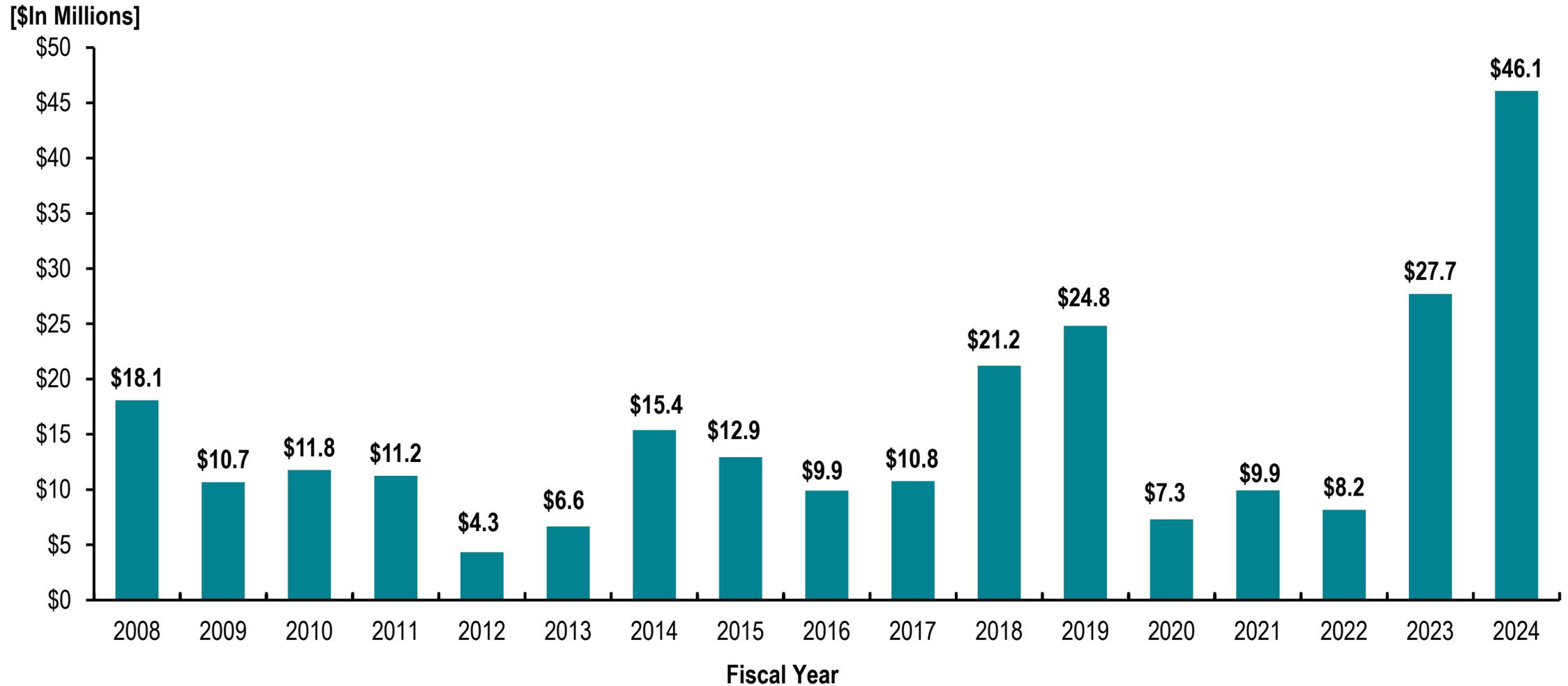
- CPS Energy for resiliency and reliability projects with input from Sustainability
- City's Resiliency, Energy Efficiency, and Sustainability Fund

City Payment Off-System Sales

City Payment from Off System Sales capped at \$10 Million annually

- Reserve amount over \$10 Million in Capital Reserve Fund
- Determine at year end if City met base budget amount
 1. Fund any shortfall in City payment base budget
 2. Remaining funds eligible to be transferred to CPS Energy to fund resiliency and reliability projects
