

Correlation between education level and income in San Antonio (2018)



Education level of San Antonio Adults Prior to COVID-19 (2018)



TfJSA Funding by Category









RTW Contract: Program Evaluation Services

- Original RFP Cancelled
 - Lack of qualified responses
- WDO sought 3 alternative options
 - UTSA Urban Education Institute
 - UT Ray Marshall Center
 - Westat
- Interlocal Agreement
 - \$647k over 6 years
 - 1, 3-year term
 - 3, 1-year renewal options
 - FY 2022 approved budget is \$102k

- Formative Evaluation Framework
- Data dashboard
- Repository
- Quarterly written report
- Annual written report
- Micro-scripts
- Set of innovations



RTW Contract: Program Evaluation Services

- PSA between UP Partnership and Jobs for the Future
 - MOU between UP Partnership, JFF and City
 - No cost to City
 - Budget up to \$600,000 (\$200,000/year)
- Assist with program launch
 - Orientation plan to onboard partners
 - Virtual kick-off for partners and collaborators
- Provide technical assistance to City and partners
 - Site coaching
 - Interviews to assess strengths and challenges
 - Scaling assistance
 - Learning curricula for workforce ecosystem




