

RFCA #22-185002

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee, or the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District or designee, authorizes the acceptance of funds from FEMA for COVID-19 testing and treatment in an amount up to \$1,575,759.95 and ratifies the execution of a professional services agreement with BCFS Health and Human Services for COVID testing and treatment in the amount up to \$800,000.00 for a term ending June 30, 2022 and further authorizes the option to extend the term to end December 31, 2022, add an additional \$939,663.00 for a total amount not to exceed \$1,739,663, funded by the FEMA reimbursements with a cash match up to \$163,903.05 funded by the State/Local Fiscal Recovery Funds. There is no impact to the General Fund. to execute an agreement with BCFS Health and Human Services for COVID testing and treatment in an amount up to \$800,000.00 for a term ending June 30, 2022. Funding for the agreement is available through FEMA reimbursements.

SECTION 2. Upon acceptance of this ordinance, a new fund and internal order number will be created, upon which the award amount up to \$1,575,759.95 will be appropriated from FEMA. A formal final budget which will include Internal Order numbers and General Ledger numbers, and a cash match up to \$163,903.05, will be submitted by the department upon receipt. Payment not to exceed \$800,000.00 is authorized to BCFS Health and Human Services upon issuance of a purchase order, contingent upon FEMA reimbursements.

SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
