ORDINANCE

**ACCEPTING AND APROPRIATING FUNDS FROM THE
SOUTHWEST TEXAS REGIONAL ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR
TRAUMA IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$590,000.00 FOR THE SAN
ANTONIO FIRE DEPARTMENT, EMS DIVISION, MOBILE
INTEGRATED HEALTHCARE UNIT TO COORDINATE CARE
OF PATIENTS WITH MOLINA HEALTHCARE OF TEXAS, INC.**

WHEREAS, the Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council for Trauma (STRAC) was established to facilitate the development, implementation, and operation of a regional comprehensive trauma and healthcare system; and

WHEREAS, Molina Healthcare of Texas, Inc. is a managed healthcare organization that has available up to \$590,000.00 for the San Antonio Fire Department (SAFD) Mobile Integrated Healthcare Unit (MIH) to reduce demand on local emergency rooms by improving the health, comfort, and well-being of persons enrolled with Molina Healthcare, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, this grant follows a six-month pilot program approved by City Council in December, 2021, and is to reduce demand on local emergency departments which are subject to overcrowding by improving outcomes and coordinating care of assigned patients; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager and designee, and the Chief of SAFD and designee, are hereby authorized to accept funds from the STRAC in an amount up to \$590,000.00 that will be used by the SAFD MIH Unit to provide contract services to Molina Healthcare, Inc., and are further authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate said acceptance.

SECTION 2. Upon approval of this Ordinance, a new fund and internal number will be created, and the sum of up to \$590,000.00 will be appropriated in said fund.

SECTION 3: The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific Cost Centers, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, General Ledger Accounts, and Fund Numbers as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
