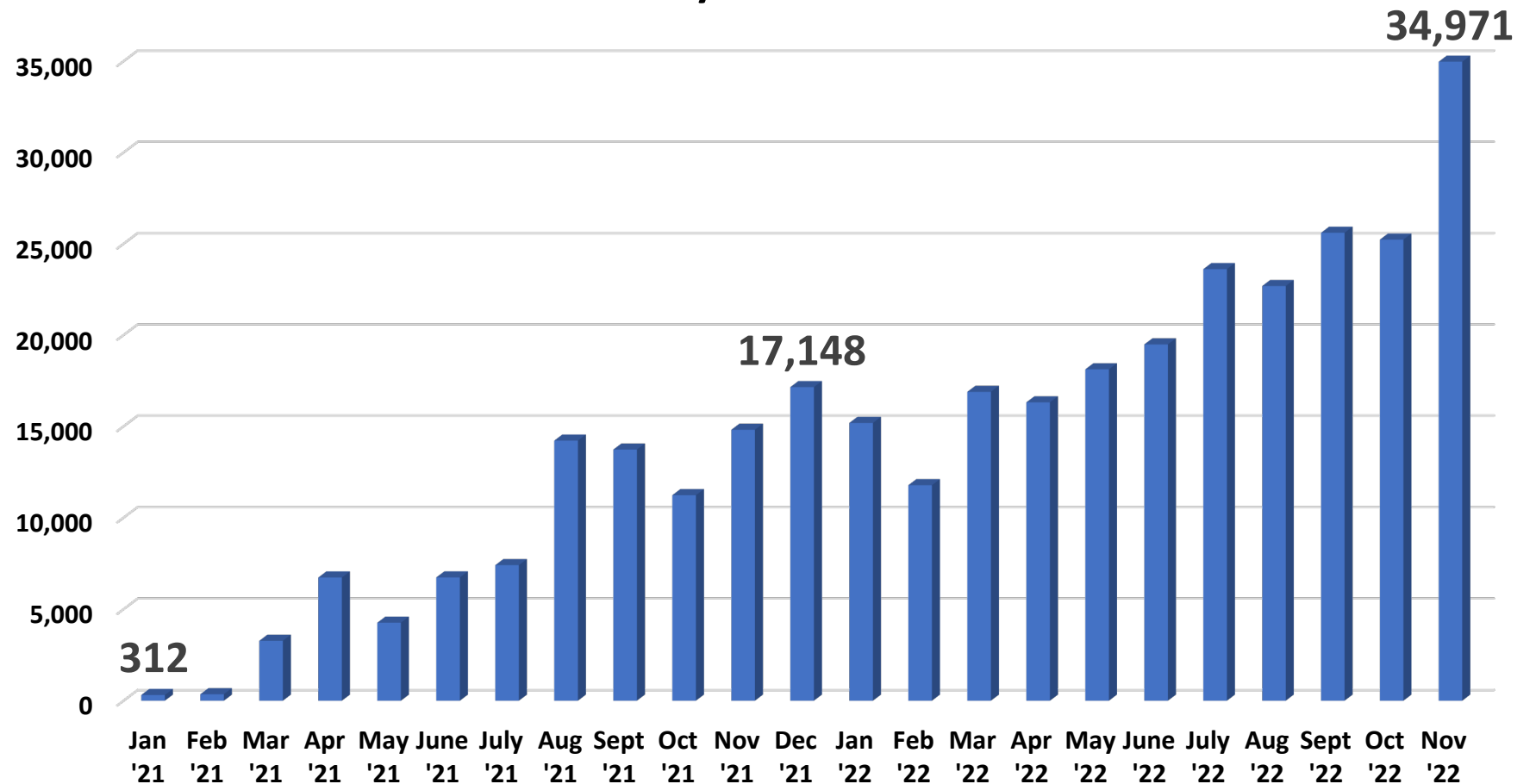

Background

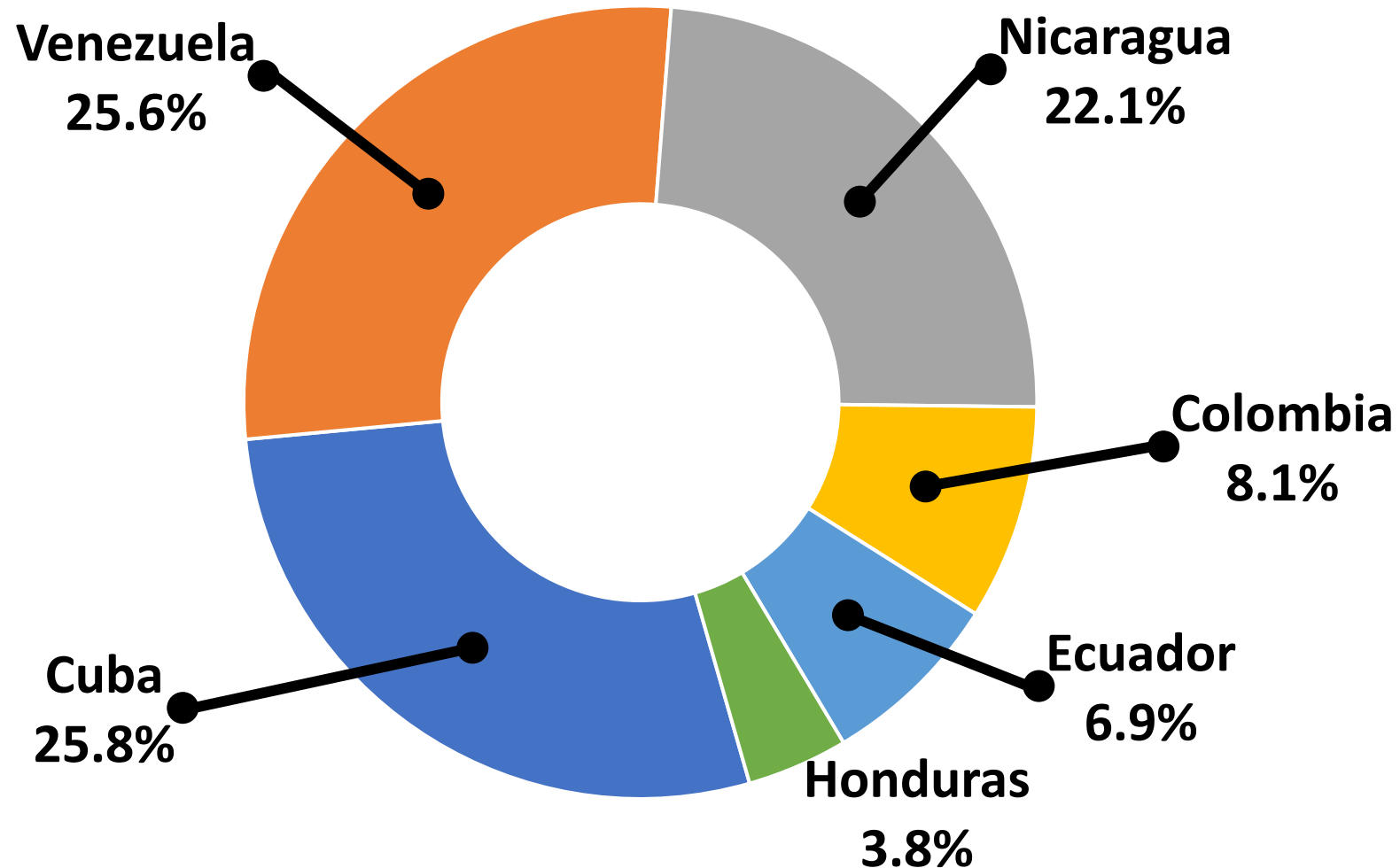
- Since Jan. 2021, more than 330,000 migrants served
- San Antonio is nearest transportation hub for border cities and federal Detention Facilities

Monthly Migrant Arrivals in San Antonio
January 2021 – November 2022



Top Nationalities of Arrivals

(July 2022 to November 2022) *Representing 92% of all arrivals*



Migrant Resource Center Centro de Bienvenida

- Opened July 7 and intended to:
 - Streamline City of San Antonio and partner agency efforts
 - Provide a single point of entry for service
 - Minimize disruption and congestion at the San Antonio International Airport and downtown
- Partnership with Catholic Charities began on October 1, 2022
- Close to 92,000 asylum seekers served since opening

Services at the MRC

Catholic Charities

- Daily Operations of the Center
- Food
- Assistance with travel arrangements
- Case management

City of San Antonio

- Coordination with Federal Agencies, local and border non-profits and other providers
- Maintains a shelter manager at MRC
- Building Maintenance
- Transportation

December 15th Council Item

- Authorizes City Manager to :
 - ✓ Accept funds from FEMA for MRC expenses for January through March 2023 in the amount of \$3,038,252
 - ✓ Execute any necessary contracts, leases, and operations and support services
- FEMA earmarked funds for the City and Catholic Charities through end of January
- FEMA meets the week of January 2nd to consider February and March Commitments
- Monthly cost of the City and Catholic Charities is approximately \$4.1 million

Recommendation

- Staff the request and acceptance of grant funds from the National Board Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) in an amount up to \$3,038,252.00 for FEMA expenses related to assistance provided to migrants traveling through San Antonio in coordination with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for the period of January 1, 2023 – March 31, 2023.
