ORDINANCE

ACCEPTING THE LOWEST RESPONSIVE BID AND AWARDING THE 2023 STREET REHABILITATION TASK ORDER CONTRACT PACKAGE 11 (RECONSTRUCTION) TO J&P PAVING CO., INC IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$5,159,017.40, OF WHICH \$92,250.00 WILL BE REIMBURSED BY SAN ANTONIO WATER SYSTEM (SAWS) AND \$8,000.00 WILL BE REIMBURSED BY CPS ENERGY FOR NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS TO THEIR EXISTING INFRASTRUCTURE. FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE FROM THE GENERAL FUND, ADVANCED TRANSPORTATION DISTRICT FUND, RIGHT OF WAY, 2022 GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND PROGRAM, DEBT PROCEEDS, AND OTHER FUNDING SOURCES INCLUDED IN THE FY 2023 – FY 2028 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM.

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WHEREAS, with the adoption of the FY 2023 Budget on September 15, 2022, City Council approved a \$116 million annual budget for the Street Maintenance Program (SMP); and

WHEREAS, this task order contract enables Public Works to execute multiple projects delivered through the Street Maintenance Program (SMP); and

WHEREAS, this ordinance authorizes one contract for FY 2023 totaling \$5,159,017.40 to J&P Paving Co., Inc. for the construction of street maintenance projects including: street reconstruction to include subgrade and treatment, installation of flexible and asphaltic base courses, installation of asphalt surface course, concrete curbs, sidewalks, curb ramps, driveways, and any other required work for the completion of the SMP Rehabilitation projects located throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, this project was advertised on February 24, 2023, and five (5) bids were received and opened on April 4, 2023, with J&P Paving Co., Inc. submitting the lowest responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, this task order contract will be awarded in compliance with the Small Business Economic Development Advocacy (SBEDA) Program. J&P Paving Co., Inc. has committed to satisfying the 18% Minority/Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) and 3% African American Business Enterprise (AABE) subcontracting goals; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance accepts the lowest responsive bid and awards the 2023 Street Rehabilitation Task Order Contract Package 11 to J&P Paving Co., Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$5,159,017.40, of which \$92,250.00 will be reimbursed by SAWS and \$8,000.00 will be

reimbursed by CPS Energy for necessary adjustments to their existing infrastructure. Funds are available from the General Fund, Advanced Transportation District Fund, Right of Way, 2022 General Obligation Bond Program, debt proceeds, and other funding sources included in the FY 2023 – FY 2028 Capital Improvement Program; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee, or the Director of the Public Works Department or designee, is authorized to accept the lowest responsive bid and award the 2023 Street Rehabilitation Task Order Contract Package 11 (Reconstruction) to J&P Paving Co., Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$5,159,017.40.

SECTION 2. Payment is authorized to be encumbered and made payable to J&P Paving Co., Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$5,159,017.40. Payment is in support of the FY2023 Street Maint Program (SMP) Project using Fund 40099000 with WBS 23-04085-10-05-02-01 and GL account 5201140. Funding for this project is provided by CO Bonds, Tax Notes, ARPA, General Fund, ADT and ROW and is in the FY2023-FY2028 CIP Budget. Reimbursement of \$92,250.00 shall be received from SAWS and reimbursement of \$8,000.00 from CPS.

Payment is limited to the amounts budgeted in the Operating and/or Capital Budget funding sources identified. All expenditures will comply with approved operating and/or capital budgets for current and future fiscal years.

SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific Fund Numbers, Project Definitions, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, Fund Centers, Cost Centers, Functional Areas, Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
