During the time that I was Chair, I served ex officio on the Planning Commission. Prior to serving on Zoning, I represented District 5 on the Historic Design and Review Commission. In addition to my work with the City, I served for two years as Treasurer for the Roosevelt Park Neighborhood Association and have served as a Lector at San Fernando Cathedral.
Please provide a brief narrative outlining your reasons for seeking appointment to this board or commission:	Over the five years, I have had the privilege of representing District 5 on the Zoning Commission. During that time, I have worked hard to represent the District at all levels of leadership on the Commission. The work that I performed as a zoning commissioner, including taking a leadership role during the process of amending the Unified Development Code, has been fulfilling but I believe that there is still work to be done. Even having reviewed five years of zoning cases, I continue to learn from each case that is brought before the Commission and believe that I can continue to serve District 5 as the City shepherds development in light of the one million additional inhabitants expected over the next seven years. This will require careful balancing of numerous interests of the community, the District and the City. Given my experience with the Zoning Commission, I believe that I am well equipped to succeed in this endeavor over the next two years.
