1. Observed two classrooms out of ratio, one teacher to four children during visit. Child Care Center is required to submit a Plan of Action to ensure two teachers are maintained in the classroom at all times.

- Books needing replacing in one classroom
- Classroom Daily Checklist not completed correctly
- o Carpets in need of cleaning
- Teacher's required training certificates not available for review
- Evidence of chipped paint in classrooms
- Fire Inspection expired at two sites
