Real Estate Disposition: Closure of an unimproved portion of a 10-foot wide alley Public Right-of-Way

SUMMARY:

A Resolution recommending the closure, vacation and abandonment of an unimproved portion of a 10-foot wide alley Public Right-of-Way within New City Block 6211 in Council District 2, as requested by Leonardo Rodriguez for a fee of \$13,918.00.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Leonardo Rodriguez (Petitioner) is requesting to close, vacate and abandon an unimproved portion of a 10-foot wide alley Public Right-of-Way within New City Block 6211 in Council District 2, as shown on the attached map. The public right-of-way consists of 0.032 of an acre (1,400 square

feet). Petitioner owns all the abutting property to the proposed closure. If approved, Petitioner will incorporate the proposed closure with its adjacent property and use it for parking at La Coronela Mexican Restaurant located at 201 N. New Braunfels Avenue.

ISSUE:
