### IV. Director's Report

ACS Director Shannon Sims discussed the Texas Unites Conference, the current struggle with live release numbers, and the importance of supporting residents with resources through the new CASA program. Sims announced the winner of the Brackenridge Clinic City contract is the Dallas-Fort Worth organization, Spay Neuter Network, as well as improvements and renovations being made to the Brackenridge Clinic facility.

Board Member Jarl asked if CASA was going to be collecting data on reasons for Owner Surrenders. CASA Manager, Kate Powell, confirmed.

A question was asked for the new location of PetShotz, which Sims provided as 3306 N. Saint Mary's; near the City's Brackenridge Clinic facility.

Board Member Speer asked if the Food Bank was the only pet pantry option available for residents. Sims responded that CASA has networked with multiple programs and organizations to provide food resources for citizen's pets, as well as the AniMeals program by Meals on Wheels which will provide food for both residents in need as well as their pets.

8. A Briefing on the Partner Focus Group.

Director Shannon Sims presented on the feedback received during Partner Focus Group, which was the final data gathering initiative of the new Strategic Plan development.

9. A Briefing on ACS' Legislative Priorities for the Next State Legislative Cycle

Director Shannon Sims presented on the timeline and priorities for the upcoming Texas Legislative Cycle.

### VII. Public Comment

- a. Lynda Ramirez discussed mandatory spaying or neutering of reclaimed pets.
- b. Chrissy Campbell discussed the use of the Next Door app regarding stray and roaming pets, and owner responsibilities.
- c. Vicki Steerman discussed backyard breeding, enforcement, and making Advisory Board meeting materials available to the public.

- d. Frances Ely discussed utilizing the Petco Love [Lost] app, improving public awareness of ACS, and microchip registration process.
- e. Ktrynha Rangel discussed the euthanizing of animals for space. Rangel also recommended process improvements being needed for owner surrenders, medical documentation, and transports.
- f. Carol Gatzert discussed personal fostering experiences and recommended more incentives to foster.
- g. Jenna Loos discussed personal experience with microchips not being registered by ACS, issues with backyard breeding, and making resident resources available on other sides of town as well.
- h. Nadia Rivera discussed the increased need for fostering as well as suggested the creation of an ACS mobile app that would also have available resources listed in it.
- i. John Bachman discussed dead animal pickup, inconsistencies between the City's website and ACS' website, and how difficult it can be to find the documents on the City website. Bachman also discussed concerns about the new Brackenridge Clinic contract.

### IV. Director's Report

ACS Director Shannon Sims provided an overview of animal welfare nationwide and the national trends of high intake and decreased live release outcomes. He stated that ACS reviewed existing policies and procedures to make adjustments and that initial results show good progress is being made.

Director Sims provided updates on the following items:

- 1. ACS hired two veterinarians
- 2. Mass vaccine clinic with Petco Love (over 5,000 vaccines anticipated) will be held March 25-26, 2023
- 3. Animal Defense League vaccination clinics are doing well
- 4. Big Fix event will be held in District 3 on April 15, 2023

### 7. A Briefing on the Spay Neuter Network (Virtual).

Executive Director of the Spay Neuter Network (SNN), Jordan Craig, provided a virtual briefing and overview of SNN, their Mission and Vision, and Brackenridge Clinic timeline.

Jordan Craig and Board Members discussed availability of flyers and advertisement as well as overview of SNN transport program.

Jordan Craig and Board Members discussed the donation of towels/blankets/comforters and Craig stated they are accepting donations. Staff is onsite Tuesday through Friday from 8:00am-4:00pm.

8. A Briefing on the Development of the New ACS Strategic Plan.

Assistant to the Director, Shannon Oster-Gabrielson, started the briefing by providing the progression of the Strategic Plan up to current day. Director Sims continued the presentation and discussed the current feedback and development which included more staff input, individual City Council member meetings, and the current Focus Areas and Goals of the new Strategic Plan.

### 9. A Briefing on ACS Operations

Director Sims provided an update on new processes implemented to help with live release outcomes such as enhanced Return-to-Owner (RTO) efforts, neighborhood canvasing, and microchips.

#### VII. Public Comment

- a. Frances Ely of District 2 recommended having Petco grooming students work on ACS pets. She suggested using an emergency phone dedicated to Urgent List potential adopters. Ely suggested a volunteer program to help residents with lack of resources. Ely ended with the recommendation of having a large transport vehicle to take dogs North.
- b. Pam Gould of District 7 recommended more school district partnerships to help raise the standard level of care for pets as well as career day opportunities.
- c. John Atwood of District 6 discussed resources and spay & neuter. Atwood mentioned the frequency of dog fighting, dog breeding, and dog abandonment in San Antonio. He stated the Mayor needs to give more resources to ACS and that everyone should report issues and cast their votes.
- d. Robert DeLeon of District 6 discussed personal experience with the TNR Program. DeLeon stated he felt lost in figuring out what to do and the difficulties connecting with staff on the phone. DeLeon ended with the obstacles in scheduling appointments and getting cages.

- e. Emily Casso of District 3 discussed difficulties getting in touch with her Councilwoman. Casso continued with South-East side of town being a major dumping ground for pets. She stated the community is not learning despite resources to educate and that San Antonio needs to have a new plan.
- f. Maryanne Rivas of District 5 stated that the community needs to do something and stop blaming. She recommended fixing confusion, communications, and lack of info for fosters. Rivas said to fix policies, procedures, timeframes, misinformation, and not answer e-mails.
- g. Damon Jackson of District 6 gave speaking time to Jenna Loos.
- h. Amy Bagley gave speaking time to Vicki Steerman.
- i. Jenna Loos of District 10 stated she met with a group about banning horse carriages in San Antonio. Loos stated her personal experiences with rescue organizations seems like there is an ACS versus Rescue mentality, and that there needs to be more working together and better communication. She stated that there should be an open forum opportunity with the ACS Advisory Board. Loos recommended improvements to Do Not Adopt/Foster listing to help with animals returning to ACS. She addressed that SAPA! was no longer posting at risk pets. Loos ended with recommending more spay & neuter events and microchip events.
- j. Jen Brown of District 1 said to lead by example through fostering pets. Brown discussed doing Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) for dogs and existing dog TNR programs in Puerto Rico. She continued with recommending a contact phone line to report backyard breeders instead of calling 3-1-1. Brown recommended collaborations with Neighborhood Associations. She stated she hopes ACS takes a stance against horse carriages.
- k. Cecilia Garza asked questions about internships and recommended internships for students to work at ACS. She requested marketing on transportation options and asked questions about volunteers transporting pets to-and-from drop off sites. She recommended advertising on VIA buses, trans-guide, and at the Department of Motor Vehicles. Garza expressed concerns over RTO being the right option and asked about follow-up on RTO's where owners have repeat issues. She ended with barriers to fostering.
- 1. John Bachman discussed spay & neuter to get to zero population growth and the need to do an initial survey. Bachman discussed the spay & neuter target numbers for ACS contracts. Bachman recommended putting more pressure on spay & neuter for dogs and less pressure on cats. He stated more high-volume spay & neuter options are needed. Bachman ended with a recommendation for an open forum meeting.
- m. Vicki Steerman of District 7 asked about a replacement for SAPA! Urgents and Adoptables List. Steerman discussed the dumping of pets and over-capacity issue

rescues. She discussed stray and roaming concerns as well as having more spay & neuter opportunities available. Steerman encouraged good pet ownership through power peers and stated that citizens need to get involved and show up to City Council meetings.







### **SUMMARY:**

Animal Care Services will provide the Advisory Board with an update on the Department's development of a new strategic plan, as well as a briefing on immediate public safety actions.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

ACS's first strategic plan was created in 2006, then amended in 2012. A decade has passed and ACS has achieved nearly all of the goals set by the plan and, as a result, ACS is a very different department than 10 years ago.

ACS recognized the need for strong, comprehensive vision for the future and proposed the creation of a new strategic plan.

In the Fall of 2021, ACS began to conceptualize a strategic plan process, and laid out a map to create the new plan. ACS identified three phases to develop the plan: Discovery Phase, Engagement Phase, and Finalization Phase.

The Discovery Phase occurred between January and May 2022 and included internal interviews with ACS leadership, an ACS staff survey, best practice research, a public input survey, and interviews with ACS Advisory Board members.

The Engagement Phase began in Summer 2022 and included an ACS Advisory Board retreat, five community input meetings, and a focus group with ACS partners.

The Finalization Phase began in January 2023, during which staff utilized all of the research and feedback collected during Phases 1 and 2 to begin developing the actual plan. The strategic plan includes 5 focus areas, each of which incorporates strategic goals and objectives, along with action plans on how to accomplish the goals and how to measure success.

The five focus areas identified for the strategic plan include:

- Support a safe community for people in their neighborhoods
- Protect the safety and humane treatment of pets
- Support the placement of pets for life
- Foster positive connections with the community
- Empower a healthy and thriving workforce






