AN ORDINANCE

**AUTHORIZING THE EXTENSION OF LINE-OF-DUTY
INJURY LEAVE FOR SAN ANTONIO FIRE DEPARTMENT
FIREFIGHTER SHANTEL MORN .**

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WHEREAS, section 143.073 of the Texas Local Government Code provides that a firefighter injured in the line of duty is entitled to line-of-duty injury leave with full pay for a period commensurate with the injury and not to exceed one year; and

WHEREAS, section 143.073 also provides that a municipality's governing body may extend the line-of-duty injury leave beyond one year; and

WHEREAS, San Antonio Fire Department Firefighter Shantel Morn suffered an occupational illness while on duty on January 1, 2022, and, as a result, required leave in excess of one year to address said injury; and

WHEREAS, Firefighter Morn is requesting an extension of line-of-duty injury leave beyond one year for the period January 22, 2022, to April 21, 2022 and September 21, 2022, to June 21, 2023; and

WHEREAS, approving the requested extension will restore 552 hours of accrued leave to Firefighter Morn; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. An extension beyond one year of San Antonio Fire Department Firefighter Morn's line-of-duty injury leave for the period January 22, 2022 to April 21, 2022 and September 21, 2022 to June 21, 2023, is hereby approved.

SECTION 2. Potential funding sources for this ordinance include but are not limited to cost savings within the fund centers, adjustments to the year-end accrual for leave payable, and Closing Ordinance. All expenditures will be in accordance with the current fiscal year budget approved by City Council.

SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager’s designee, correct allocations to specific Cost Centers, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, General Ledger Accounts, and Fund Numbers as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
