John Bauchman and Laura Linam spoke in support of more assistance for animals, moving to a no-kill shelter, and analyzing the budget for Animal Care Services.

Ruby Wilkins requested help for a homeless disabled woman who was repeatedly found on MLK Street.

Hayat Majali requested that the City Council approve a Resolution requesting a cease fire in Gaza.

Veronica Salas, representing an all-women's bicycle club, requested harsher sentences for drivers that killed cyclists, particularly drunk drivers.

Jesse Ortega expressed concern about bike safety and stated that his neighborhood had a problem with street racing and large trucks. He requested more patrols for Fiesta.

Joshua Hinson complained about being arrested for creating sidewalk chalk art.

Regina Smith complained about drug dealers in her neighborhood and asked for help for the homeless, mentally ill, and animals.
