SUBJECT: Citywide Traffic Analysis

Issue Proposed for Consideration:

I ask for your support for the inclusion of the following item on the agenda of the earliest available meeting of the Governance Committee:

Requesting City staff to conduct a city-wide traffic analysis that:

- 1) Analyzes existing traffic patterns;
- 2) Identifies areas of the city that experience frequent congestion, speeding, and other traffic-related issues;
- 3) Determines recommendations to support long-lasting improvements to increase safety, reduce congestion, and enhance mobility;
- 4) Serves as a tool for our Transportation Department for planning purposes; and
- 5) Will be used to support the strategic deployment of city resources, including the re-examination of the traffic calming application to include speedbumps and the criteria necessary to qualify for traffic mitigation measures.

Brief Background:

Traffic patterns, whether related to the need for traffic calming solutions or the mitigation of congestion, continue to be a growing concern for residents and visitors alike. Cities across the country, including Midland, TX; Johnston, IA; and Irvine, CA, have initiated citywide efforts to analyze and resolve traffic concerns in their cities.

Requests for traffic mitigation remain one of our community's most pervasive demands. Traffic congestion and associated delays have a nearly immeasurable impact on our environment as well as pedestrian and driver safety. The purpose of this request is to initiate a city-wide traffic analysis that will lead to proactive short and long-term solutions to our growing traffic need. It should also proactively identify warranted traffic calming solutions, mitigating the need for constituents to request them.


The results of the study should complement and aid our Vision Zero and SA Tomorrow goals.






