3. Public Art: City Tower Flores Street Mural Artist Selection (Action)

Talamantez presented Joe De La Cruz for the public art opportunity at City Tower. Talamantez provided details of project scope, stakeholders, and community engagement, and displayed examples of artist work and experience. The Public Art Committee approved the artist selection. A timeline for the project was provided.

Commission Discussion:

Williams inquired of a list of artists that were invited for the Request for Proposals and the art renderings. Talamantez listed the names of the artists who presented a design proposal. Mirelez stated public art design process.

Clark requested date when the concept would be proposed. Talamantez forecasted concept would be slated for summer schedule. Mirelez reiterated the concept design is only presented to the Public Art Committee and the final design will be presented to the Commission.

Campsey stated he participated on the artist selection panel adding all artist did a fantastic job.

Lozano inquired if the public art project was leaning more to black and white aesthetic or a more colorful mural. Talamantez stated artist proposed a colorful piece as the community engagement feedback survey outcome called for a vibrant mural.

4. Public Art: 2023 Call for Panelist (Action)

Torres went on to present exhibits currently on view are *Millennial Lotería* on the first floor and *Permanencia Voluntaria* on the second floor. Both exhibits opened on February 8 and will be on exhibit thru June 30. Torres invited all to attend ancillary events scheduled as well.

Dlugosz presented an overview of the grant's timeline for panelists, professional artist and nonprofit organizations including grant opening and closing dates for artists grants, operational and culturally specific grants, events grants, and productions costs grants.

Announcements and Reports

Performing Arts, Film and Music Committee: Film San Antonio and Music Program Updates
LeBlanc shared film and music updates as follows:

#filmSA Contest 2024 - Annual contest launched December 13, 2023. This contest is coordinating by the San Antonio Film Commission in partnership with the World Heritage Office. Contest inspires youth to explore the art and craft in filmmaking. Contest consists of two categories *Beyond the Plate*, exploring San Antonio's food system and *Lights, Camera, Action SA* with young filmmakers exploring what makes San Antonio a great place to live and work. Submission will be received thru March 25, 2024. An expanded outreach and engagement include film educators at area high schools, colleges, and university programs. Four winners will be presented a \$1,000 cash prize at the awards ceremony and screening at Mission Marque Plaza May 4, 2024.

Film Festival Funding Program Update – 2024 – 2026 grant cycle launched February 1. Program supports the development of local film culture through San Antonio based film festivals. The intent to apply deadline is February 15, 2024, and an application deadline of February 29, 2024.

Artis Forum: Logistics of Filmmaking – In collaboration with Texas Public Radio, the first artist forum *Logistics of Filmmaking* with a focus on logistics of filmmaking taking place February 27 at Texas Public Radio from 6 pm – 9 pm, offering attendees free headshots including panel discussion with film industry professionals and local short screening. Free and open to the public. Parking validation offered by Texas Public Radio for City Tower Parking Garage.

Film Active Production Update: Working with large scale cable television series and a list of location scouting.

MovieMaker Magazine: For the sixth year in a row, San Antonio votes as best places to live and work as a moviemaker.

Local Music Spotlight Program Update: Program features San Antonio musicians, song writers and highlight their original music on City of San Antonio channel. Launched winter application cycle November 17, 2023, and with January 2 as the deadline to apply. Thirteen (13) songs from eight (8) San Antonio musicians submitted and 8 selected. Each musician/band will be compensated with a \$250 honorarium for selected use of their music. Selected songs can also be used in Arts community engagements. Future opportunities to submit in Spring and Summer 2024.

Make Music Alliance – San Antonio partnering with Make Music Alliance to launch San Antonio’s inaugural participation in **Make Music Day**. The annual event takes place June 21 around the world. San Antonio musicians, venues and organizations will collaborate to self-produce and host free and open to the public music programs of all genres. Department of Arts and Culture will serve as an anchor having signed the City up to participate and is working with Texas Public Radio for *Local Music Spotlight* stage.

Jones stated the Department is advertising many of the programs such as grants and contests on the City’s text messaging system.

Director’s Report

San Antonio Arts Commission Update – Jones informed the Commission the San Antonio Arts Commission City Council Districts 5 Andy Benavides and District 6 Emily Fleisher have resigned. Both seats are open and available for appointment by their respective City Councilmember.

Upcoming Events

Lozano invited all Commissioners to Luminaria’s recently completed mural at Mission County Park on San Antonio’s South Side which commemorates the migrants that perished in 2022. Selected 3 artist include: Mauro De La Tierra, Andrea Rivas, and Adrian De La Cruz

Arastu stated Musical Bridges Around the World completed *The Gurwitz – International Piano Competition*. The competition included participants from 21 nations around the world with Dionne Warwick who served as the 2024 Honorary Chair.
