**Brief Description of Item(s) and Use:** This contract will provide a veterinary vaccines, pharmaceuticals, and supplies to benefit the animals served by Animal Care Services Department (ACS). As a municipally owned animal shelter, ACS operates under an open-admission system, caring for approximately 30,000 animals per year. These veterinary vaccines, pharmaceuticals, and supplies will ensure ACS animals receive appropriate veterinary care and that proper supplies are available to the ACS employees who work and care for these animals.
