Colonel Richard Brewer urged the City to provide space and fund a notable public display for the 6th Army Alamo Scouts. He submitted written testimony requesting the same.

Deanna Lee submitted written testimony and stated that a Townhall was organized with a specific focus on highlighting the pet rescue community's contribution toward reducing the stray population and the support needed to continue rescuing strays. She noted that the pet rescue community would like to collaborate with the City to reduce the stray population.

John Bachman provided written testimony and urged the City to increase spay and neuter operations at Animal Care Services to service 100,000 cats and dogs in San Antonio annually.

Edward Ocampo Sr. spoke of zip codes, himself and his dog being poisoned by Arsenic.

Zachary Stuart spoke of the Blackspur Youth Agriculture Initiative which worked with troubled youth and he requested resources and support from the City
