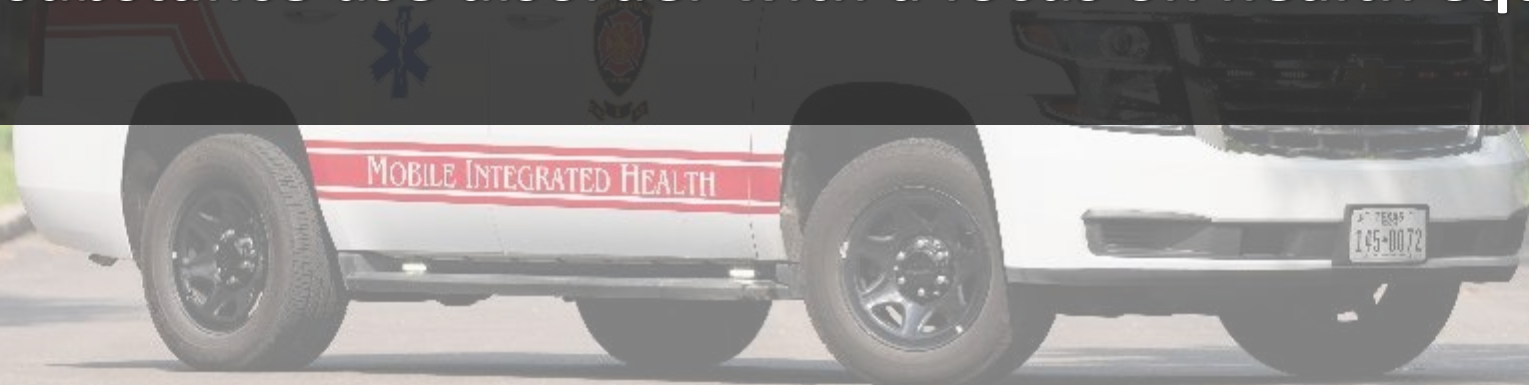

Purpose

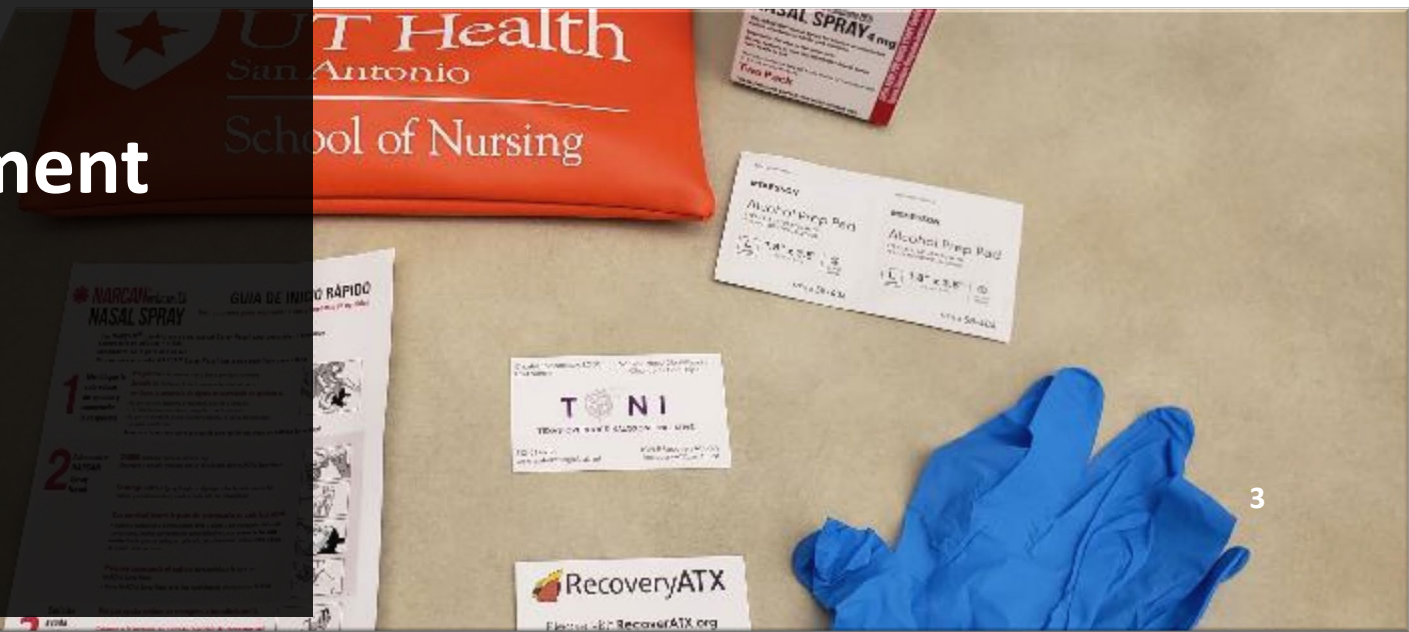
Nearly all people who use Opioids use at least 3 other drugs. This contribution will serve the people of City of San Antonio affected by or at risk of overdose from alcohol and general substance use disorder with a focus on health equity.



Overview

The SAFD Mobile Integrated Healthcare Opioid programs encompasses the following:

- Texas Targeted Opioid Response (TTOR)
- Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)



Plan of Action

Expand on existing limitations experienced by current TTOR and MAT programs to include services to individuals using alcohol, cocaine, methamphetamine, or other poly-substances that have delayed asking for help due to restrictions associated with COVID-19

Recommendations

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance to accept the contribution up to \$79,878 from the Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council for Trauma (STRAC)





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
