WHEREAS, it is now necessary to canvass the results of the election; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Council officially finds, determines, and declares the election was properly ordered, legal notice of the election was properly given, proper election officers were appointed prior to the election, the election was legally held, all qualified voters of the City were permitted to vote at the election, due returns of the results of the election were made and delivered, and the Council has canvassed the returns, in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, the United States of America, and the Ordinance ordering the election.

SECTION 2. The Council finds and determines the six Propositions listed in the recitals and below were approved and passed by the voters at the election, that the election was duly called, that proper notice was given, and that the election was held in all aspects in conformity with the law, and that the Council is authorized to issue the bonds and to levy the tax in accordance with the authority granted in the Propositions and with the law:

- A. A MAJORITY of the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, Texas voting in the election, voted FOR Proposition A by 71.35% of the total votes cast.
- **B.** A MAJORITY of the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, Texas voting in such election, having voted **FOR Proposition B by 71.94**% of the total votes cast.
- C. A MAJORITY of the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, Texas voting in such election, voted **FOR Proposition C by 64.69%** of the total votes cast.
- **D.** A MAJORITY of the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, Texas voting in such election, voted **FOR Proposition D by 64.65%** of the total votes cast.

- E. A MAJORITY of the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, Texas voting in such election, voted FOR Proposition E by 65.09% of the total votes cast.
- F. A MAJORITY of the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, Texas voting in such election, voted FOR Proposition F by 59.79% of the total votes cast.
- **SECTION 3.** The recitals contained in the preamble are found to be true, are made a part of this Ordinance for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the Council.
- SECTION 4. All ordinances and resolutions, or their parts, in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling.
- **SECTION 5.** This Ordinance shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.
- **SECTION 6.** If any provision of this Ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and this Ordinance would have been enacted without such invalid provision.
- **SECTION 7.** It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at this meeting, including this Ordinance, was given as required by Texas Government Code Chapter 551.

SECTION 8. This Ordinance is effective upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective 10 days after passage.

Ordinance canvassing the May 7, 2022 election results for the City of San Antonio's 20222027 General Obligation Bond Program. [Debbie RaccaSittre, Interim City Clerk] Debbie RaccaSittre, Interim City Clerk, provided the results of the City of San Antonio 2022-2027 General Obligation Bond Program Election. Racca Sittre reported the final results of votes cast for Proposition A Streets, Bridges and Sidewalks 71% For and 29% Against; Proposition B Drainage and Flood Control was 72% For and 28% Against; Proposition C Parks, Recreation and Open Space Improvements was 65% For and 35% Against; Proposition D Library and Cultural Facilities was 65% For and 35% Against; Proposition E Public Safety Facilities was 65% For and 35% Against; and Proposition F was 60% For and 40% Against, stated that all propositions were carried by voters and recommended the results be canvassed. Mayor Nirenberg thanked the Voters, City Clerk and Bexar County Elections Department. City Manager Erik Walsh provided a timeline for implementation of the Bond and next steps.
