- HB 1024 signed into state law in May 2021:
  - Alcohol To-Go: Individuals can take alcoholic beverages purchased with food off-premises

# Section 3-24: Proposed Renovation

No person under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, or other controlled substances shall operate a vehicle or aircraft on the airport.

Alcoholic beverages can be consumed in any public terminal area without designation, including the area adjacent to the aircraft loading gates designated for use by passengers waiting to board an aircraft.

No persons while boarding or in any restricted areas shall be in possession of a bottle, can, or other receptacle containing an alcoholic beverage that has been opened, or with a broken seal, or the contents of which have been partially removed, unless the bottle, can, or other receptacle is enclosed in a suitcase or carrying case.
