- Most damage was limited to cooling tower and stairwell #1
- Initial remediation completed to mitigate further damage to the facility
- Damage has not impacted public service at Central Library
- Construction contract approved by City Council on 12/16/21
- Communication plan deployed to keep staff, patrons and stakeholders informed
- Work coordinated with Central Bond project scope to minimize impact to public service
- Library staff working with FEMA for potential re-imbursement to the city for this project
- Ensuring safety is maintained with stairwells and placement of appropriate emergency exits signage
- Work prioritized based on needs of May 21, 2022 Book Festival
- Pre-construction meeting held March 9, 2022
- Project Phase: Construction
- Estimated Percentage Construction Complete as of July 2022: 100%
- Construction began March 21, 2022
- Stairwell was closed and signage directed patrons and staff to alternate exits

- Construction contract approved by City Council on Dec. 16, 2021
- Carpet replacement will make access to the collection difficult
- Interim service planning is being provided at Granados Adult & Senior Center
- Closest Branch Library to Westfall is Landa – 2.3 miles away
- Closure began Monday, March 28, endorsed by Facilities Committee on 2/9 & approved by Library Board on 2/23
- Project Phase: Construction
- Estimated Percentage Construction Complete as of June 2022: 35%
- Construction began March 28, 2022
- Asbestos was found under flooring and will require remediation.
- Public Works Environmental is coordinating all abatement activities currently on-going
- A complete refresh of communication plan is underway to brief all stakeholders/community on this development
- Westfall expected to re-open Fall 2022

Landa Branch Library Improvements

Project Budget - \$30,000 (Capital Improvement Project)

Project Scope: Install weather-stripping and hardware improvements on French doors and windows around the building to increase efficiency of HVAC system

- Funds were remaining in previous HVAC project
- A communication plan being developed to keep staff, patrons and stakeholders informed
- Branch will not close during this work, no service interruptions anticipated
- Purchase Order issued 2/9
- Estimated Percentage Construction Complete as of June 2022: 90%
- Long lead items including hardware
- Work to be completed by July/August 2022

Carver Branch Library 2022 Bond Initiative

Project Budget - \$12,500,000 2022-2027 Bond Project (Approved May 2022)

Project Scope: The Carver Branch Library project would create a first of its kind area library to serve a larger area and population in District 2 with enhanced services. Project would include an expansion of approx. 10,000sf, making Carver the largest branch library in the SAPL system at nearly 22,000sf.

- Communication plan deployed to keep staff, patrons and stakeholders informed
- Parking lot and sidewalk work complete
- Book drop closed during renovation
- Interim services provided out of nearby Parks & Recreation facility (Natatorium)
- Nearest Branch Library from Bazan is Las Palmas – 2.3 miles away
- Approximate 6-week closure began Mon, April 11, endorsed by Facilities Committee 2/9 & Library Board on 2/23
- Project Phase: Construction close-out
- Estimated Percentage Construction Complete as of July 2022: 95%
- Walk punch conducted June 16; punch items being addressed – New automatic door installation to be scheduled in July/August 2022
- Public Reopening held June 4, 2022
