Community Crime Prevention Program

Supports the San Antonio Police Department's commitment to create partnerships with the City's community crime prevention agencies to:

- ✓ Administer and distribute \$250,000 of asset forfeiture funds included in the FY 2022 Budget
- ✓ Support evidence-based violence reduction programming and wraparound services in the areas of domestic violence, anti-drug/group violence prevention, and neighborhood security
- ✓ Demonstrate an immediate ability to address crime prevention and support programs.

Project Goals

Efforts supporting law enforcement activities and local crime prevention awareness campaigns:

- Implement the principles of community policing
- Prevent hate crimes and youth violence
- Address domestic violence
- Provide assistance to victims of crime
- Establish initiatives to reduce gun violence
- Manage drug abuse prevention, education, and treatment programs

Evaluation & Recommendation

The Evaluation Committee elected to award funding to the following agencies that submitted proposals:

- FREED Texas - \$99,000
- WestCare Texas - \$84,000
- Rising Stars - \$67,000
