Recommended Mental Health Plan

Youth - \$15 Million

Three Strategies to address increased social isolation, anxiety, and depression

- 1. Expand Mental Health Service Access for Youth ages 12 to 19
 - Target: Census tracks with high concentration of
 - Mental Health Hospitalizations
 - 911 Calls
 - Equity Atlas Score 6 and Higher
- 2. Expand Metro Health Project Worth Teen Ambassador and Stand Up SA Programs for youth ages 12 to 19
- 3. Diagnostic Services and Family Plan Development for children up to the age of 6
 - Target: Census tracks with equity atlas score of 6 and higher

Recommended Mental Health Plan Older Adults - \$5 Million

Three Strategies to address increased social isolation, anxiety, and depression

- 1. Expand Navigation Programs
- 2. Increase social interaction activities and programs
 - Expand opening hours at City Comprehensive Senior Centers (Pilot Program)
- 3. Caregiver Program Services and Coaching
 - Target: Census tracks with equity atlas score of 6 and higher

Recommended Mental Health Plan Homeless - \$5 Million

Two Strategies to address increased homeless population with mental health and substance abuse issues

- Connect Chronic and Unsheltered Veteran Homeless to Mental Health, Substance Abuse, and Housing Resources
- 2. Outreach and Services to Youth Aging Out of the Foster Care System

Recommended Mental Health Plan Collaboration - \$1 Million

Four Strategies to address behavioral health programs in Bexar County where COVID-19 has exacerbated existing conditions

Collaborate with partners to:


- 1. Establish a framework to serve and align upstream systems and organizations
- 2. Recommend/Identify a central phone number to respond to pre-crisis calls from individuals needing support and navigation
- 3. Public Education Campaign to address mental health stigma
- 4. Evaluate recently deployed 988 line for mental health

Eligibility & Scoring

- Eligibility
 - Nonprofit Organizations (501 (c) 3)
 - Faith-Based Organizations
 - Public Entities (non-COSA)
 - Minimum of 2 years in operation
 - Demonstrate disproportionate COVID-19 impact
- Scoring Criteria
 - 30 Points: Experience Background and Qualifications
 - 40 Points: Proposed Plan
 - 20 Points: Budget
 - 10 Points: Evaluation, Innovation, and/or Continuity of Effective Programming
