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2022 PCTAC Applicants at a Glance





Explain why you would like to serve on this committee.

I have found serving on the PCTAC as the Planning Professional Alternate over the past 4 years to be very rewarding and humbly submit my application for a second term as the Planning Professional representative. During my two terms, I often had the opportunity to attend meetings as a voting member when Ken Brown was unable to attend because of scheduling conflicts or recusal. Even when Ken Brown was able to attend, I often attended as a nonvoting member to stay current on the issues considered by the PCTAC and to weigh-in on the discussions. I believe my qualifications and professional experience make me uniquely qualified to be a member of PCTAC. I have worked with the UDC for over 16 years in various capacities that have provided me with a thorough knowledge and understanding of the Code. I believe my 10 years of experience working as a city planner and current experience working as an affordable housing developer allow me to assess proposed amendments in a very measured and balanced way. I feel it is my duty, and it would be a great privilege, to continue to contribute to the UDC amendment review process and ensure that changes increase workability and administrative efficiency, eliminate unnecessary development costs, and reflect changes in law and the state of the art in land use planning and urban design. Additional details about my relevant experience and qualifications are included below.

I gained considerable experience in land use policy, urban design, strategic planning, long range planning, and community development during my 10 years of employment with the City of San Antonio working as a professional planner. I learned the UDC during my early years developing and providing recommendations for the Board of Adjustment, Zoning Commission, and Planning Commission. During the middle years of my employment with the City, I led neighborhood, community, and redevelopment planning initiatives, supervised a team of plan reviewers, and wrote large sections of the UDC that were reviewed by PCTAC and Planning Commission and ultimately adopted by City Council. In the last years of my employment with the City I managed complex community development initiatives with multimillion dollar budgets and large staff teams. All of these experiences have provided me with the knowledge and technical expertise that is necessary to understand the interrelatedness of the UDC provisions and the collective impact of amendments.

My most recent professional experience as Executive Vice President/ COO at Habitat for Humanity of San Antonio and Executive Director of Cross Timber Homes has provided me with an understanding of how the UDC is applied and the impact of UDC requirements on development. Affordable housing development is perhaps more dependent than any other type of development on a thorough understanding of the land development code because there is no margin to absorb additional costs

incurred to address unanticipated Code requirements that pop up during construction. This work has demonstrated just how important it is for all stakeholders to have an opportunity to provide input on proposed code amendments and the importance of writing code in a precise way so that it can be applied equally and consistently.

In addition to my professional experience, I worked diligently for 10 years as a board member of the Southwest Texas Section of the American Planning Association to provide opportunities for local planners to learn about and discuss advances in planning theory and practice. I rejoined the board in 2021 as the Secretary.

It is with great enthusiasm and a strong commitment to public service that I submit my application for a second term on the PCTAC. I believe that my knowledge of the UDC and experience working as a city planner and as a nonprofit affordable housing developer, the ongoing work I have done to further the planning profession in San Antonio, and my exemplary service during my first term on PCTAC make me uniquely qualified to continue serving.

I am personally and professionally committed to racial and economic justice and social equity as evidenced by my 19 years of professional experience in public and nonprofit organizations. My first job out of college as a young 21 year old was working as a case manager for the Texas Health and Human Services Commission determining eligibility for public assistance programs. I took on this challenging and often thankless job because I believed it was vital that we ensure the less fortunate members of our community had access to food and basic medical care. The clients that I served were predominantly minority and exclusively low income. The majority sought assistance because a physical or mental disability, illness, or other life circumstance impacted their ability to gain and maintain a job that paid a living wage. The assistance we provided helped level the playing feel a bit so they had some capacity to work to improve their situations.

I left my job at the State after 3 years to pursue a master's degree in Community and Regional Planning. I was drawn to the planning profession in large part because of the strong ethical principles and the commitment to plan for the needs of disadvantaged groups and persons and to provide all citizens with a meaningful role in the development of plans and programs. I lived by these principles during my 10 year career working in planning for the City of San Antonio. During my time with the City I helped give predominantly minority and disadvantaged populations the opportunity to participate in local governance through the development and implementation of neighborhood, community and revitalization plans and programs. During my later years with the City, my focus shifted to community development policy where my primary goal was to increase the effectiveness of the City's commercial

revitalization and affordable housing programs that were targeted exclusively to low income neighborhoods.
