# Background

- Initiative approved in the FY 2022 Budget
- 4 initial locations recommended by the Office of Emergency Management
- Public Safety Committee Briefed in June and September 2022
- Community Engagement June to September 2022
- Today's item approves the purchase of 4 generators for the Hubs

# What is a resiliency hub?

- **Familiar, trusted, and community-serving facilities that will:**
  - Coordinate resource distribution and services before, during, and after a disaster
- **Serve the community in three modes**
  - Everyday (>99% of the time)
  - Disaster
  - Recovery
- **Provide critical services in the event of a disruption and after:**
  - Access to electricity, heating and cooling
  - Food/water, tools, overnight shelter capable
  - Information and connection to resources
  - Access to basic health and medical supplies

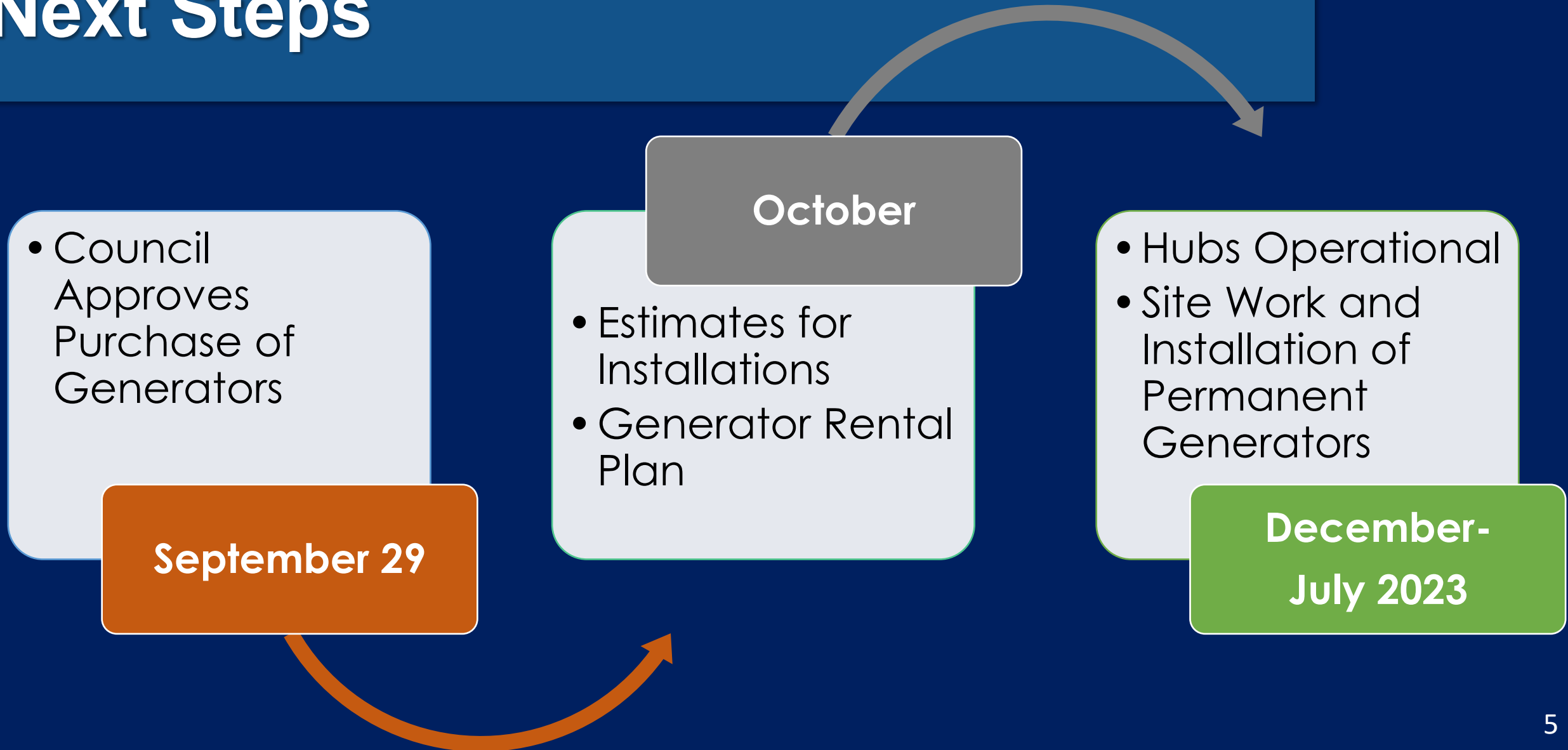
# Resiliency Hub Locations

- 4 locations, one site in each quadrant of the City
  - Southside Lions Senior Center
  - Normoyle Senior Center
  - Northeast Senior Center
  - Garza Community Center
- Purchase of 4 Generators recommended
  - 3 natural gas and 1 diesel
  - Total Cost \$335,528
