Background

- Two State-funded homeless grants from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA)
- Administered through the Homeless Housing and Services Program (HHSP)
- San Antonio is 1 of 9 Texas cities to be awarded



Homeless Housing & Services Program



- Funding for case management, street outreach, shelter, and housing services
- Addresses youth homelessness (Ages 24 & Under)
- Term: Oct. 1, 2022 Sept. 30, 2023

Roy Maas Youth Alternatives

TurningPoint Transitional Living Program Proposed Funding: \$140,094

- Serves homeless youth and youth aging out of foster care in San Antonio
- Prioritizes services to qualifying youth participating in the NXT Level program





THRIVE Youth Center

- Proposed Funding: \$60,000
- 10 emergency shelter beds on the Haven for Hope Campus
- Prioritizes LGBTQ+ homeless youth
- Rapid re-housing and street outreach
- Has served over 300 individuals





DHS Homeless Services

- Proposed Funding: \$73,277
- 1 Youth Navigator position for the Homeless Connections Hotline
- Referrals from Hotline and NXT Level program
- Hotline receives nearly 200 calls from youth experiencing homelessness each year









Haven for Hope Designation

- City has designated Haven as a subrecipient since inception of HHSP in 2009
- Designation requires reauthorization from City Council every 2 years
- Funding supports case management and capital improvements to the campus





Recommendation

Staff recommends approval to apply, and accept upon award:

- Total of \$1.1 M in grant funding through TDHCA:
 - \$273,371 in HHSP Youth Set-Aside Funds
 - \$839,059 in HHSP General Set-Aside Funds*

 Authorization to execute agreements with Roy Maas Youth Alternatives and THRIVE Youth Center

*Designated to Haven for Hope for the first of a 2-year period
