ORDINANCE

**ACCEPTING THE LOWEST RESPONSIVE BID AND APPROVING
A 2022 - 2023 TASK ORDER CONTRACT FOR STORM WATER
PROJECTS WITH PRONTO SANDBLASTING AND COATING AND
OIL-FIELD SERVICE COMPANY, INC., IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO
EXCEED \$5,372,854.00 OF WHICH \$591,584.00 WILL BE
REIMBURSED BY SAN ANTONIO WATER SYSTEM (SAWS) FOR
NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS RELATED TO THE
CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF STORM
WATER ASSOCIATED PROJECTS LOCATED CITYWIDE. FUNDS
ARE AVAILABLE FROM AND INCLUDED IN THE FY 2023 – FY
2028 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM AND MAY BE
FUNDED FROM VARIOUS FUNDING SOURCES INCLUDING, BUT
LIMITED TO, STORM WATER REVENUE BONDS, STORM
WATER OPERATING FUNDS, STORM WATER REGIONAL
FACILITIES FUNDS OR OTHER FUNDING SOURCES.**

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WHEREAS, Task Order Contracts are utilized when multiple projects are to be delivered through various programs and funding sources within a limited timeline and specific projects are not initially known. This Task Order Contract will be utilized as an as-needed basis to expedite the construction, repair and maintenance of stormwater-related projects throughout the City. Work may include channelization, the reconstruction of streets, storm drains, culverts, inlets, detention ponds and outfall structures; and

WHEREAS, the 2022 - 2023 Task Order Contract for Storm Water Projects was solicited to provide unit pricing for the construction, repair, and maintenance of stormwater projects throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, this task order contract was advertised on July 15, 2022 and two (2) bids were received and opened on August 12, 2022, with Pronto Sandblasting and Coating and Oil-field Service Company, Inc. submitting the lowest responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, this task order contract will be awarded in compliance with the following Small Business Economic Development Advocacy (SBEDA) Program Goal Setting Committee incentives: 26% Minority/Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) subcontracting goal and a 4% African-American Business Enterprise (AABE) subcontracting goal. Pronto Sandblasting and Coating and Oil-field Service Company, Inc. has committed to meeting the subcontractor participation goal; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance accepts the lowest responsive bid and awards the Task Order Contract for Storm Water Projects to Pronto Sandblasting and Coating and Oil-field Service Company, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$5,372,854.00, of which \$591,584.00 will be reimbursed by the San Antonio Water System (SAWS); **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee, or the Director of the Public Works Department or designee, is authorized to accept the lowest responsive bid and award the 2022 - 2023 Task Order Contract for Storm Water Projects to Pronto Sandblasting and Coating and Oil-field Service Company, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$5,372,854.00.

SECTION 2. Funding for this ordinance will be identified when work orders are issued. If funding for any work orders is not previously appropriated, funding will be identified and appropriated through subsequent City Council action. Payment is limited to the amounts budgeted in the Operating, Grants, and/or Capital Budget funding sources identified. All expenditures will comply with Operating, Grants, and/or Capital Budgets for current and future fiscal years.

SECTION 3. Payment not to exceed \$5,372,854.00 is authorized to be encumbered with purchase orders and made payable to Pronto Sandblasting and Coating and Oil-field Service Company, Inc. for Storm Water Projects citywide.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific Fund Numbers, Project Definitions, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, Fund Centers, Cost Centers, Functional Areas, Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
