Project Scope: Renovations, repairs, HVAC upgrades and space reconfigurations, repairs from Winter Storm Uri damage

- Project almost complete when significant damage in storm in February 2021 forced an indefinite closure.
- Initial remediation completed to mitigate further damage to the facility
- Coordination between PWD, SAPL, ORM and the city insurance adjusters on-going; pursuing FEMA assistance
- A Capital Funding request was approved as part of 2022 budget process
- City Council approved construction contract on 12/16/21
- Interim services are being offered out of the Gilbert Garza Community Center
- Communication plan in place to update the public and key stakeholders
- Project Phase: Construction
- Construction began March 21, 2022
- Estimated Percentage Construction Complete as of November 2022: 99%
- Substantial completion for contractor September 2022
- Final completion for contractor October 2022

- Branch was approved to close September 6th for the work, but shipping delays have postponed the arrival into December/January; closure will be re-scheduled

- Estimated Percentage Construction Complete as of September 2022: 0%
- Construction anticipated to start winter 2023; long lead times for HVAC equipment
- Construction work may take 6-8 weeks to complete

- A communication plan has been implemented to keep staff, patrons and stakeholders informed
- Branch is scheduled to close September 6, 2022, for 3-5 weeks or until project is complete
- Interim service will be provided at the Ramirez Community Center, 1011 Gillette (1.6 miles away)
- Closest Branch Location: Pan American Branch Library (2.9 miles away)
- Construction scheduled for September/October 2022
- Project Phase: Construction – Ordering of materials/staging/demolition
- Estimated Percentage Construction Complete as of November 2022: 45%
- Demo work began Sept. 6; Temp & humidity control will remain in effects with supplemental cooling provided
- All construction work scheduled to be complete in October
- Cortez Library has 3 units located on the roof. Demo and replacement can be done fairly quickly with a crane.
- Equipment delay; equipment delivered with missing critical components. Remaining equipment expected October 19, 2022.
- Contractor to provide temporary units for meeting room to ACCOMMODATED early voting and day of voting.
- Construction will pause October 20, 2022 for voting schedule and restart November 14, 2022.
- Inclement weather has caused additional delays
- Reopening in Late December

Westfall Branch Library Improvements

Project Scope: Flooring replacement throughout the building, front door improvements, rest room renovations, lighting improvements, interior and exterior painting, drinking fountain upgrade

- Construction contract approved by City Council on Dec. 16, 2021
- Carpet replacement will make access to the collection difficult
- Interim service planning is being provided at Granados Adult & Senior Center
- Closest Branch Library to Westfall is Landa – 2.3 miles away
- Closure began Monday, March 28, endorsed by Facilities Committee on 2/9 & approved by Library Board on 2/23
- Project Phase: Construction
- Estimated Percentage Construction Complete as of September 2022: 95%
- Construction began March 28, 2022
- Asbestos was found under flooring and will require remediation.
- A communication plan is being followed to brief all stakeholders/community on these development
- All abatement work has been completed, and construction has resumed on the building
- Construction work complete in October; library move in to follow
- Reopening November 29 2022 with “Open House” festivities

Central Library 2022 - 2027 Bond Initiative**Project Budget - \$6,000,000 2022-2027 Bond Project (Approved May 2022)**

Project Scope: The project will update areas throughout the building, as well as continue building systems work, and complete the scope of the Texana Resource Center project on the sixth floor. The project will improve existing facilities to create safe, functional, accessible, and welcoming space for the public. scoping pending.

Carver Branch Library 2022 – 2027 Bond Initiative**Project Budget - \$12,500,000 2022-2027 Bond Project (Approved May 2022)**

Project Scope: The Carver Branch Library project would create a first of its kind area library to serve a larger area and population in District 2 with enhanced services. Project would include an expansion of approx. 10,000sf, making Carver the largest branch library in the SAPL system at nearly 22,000sf.

Las Palmas Branch Library 2022 - 2027 Bond Initiative**Project Budget - \$5,250,000 2022-2027 Bond Project (Approved May 2022)**

Project Scope: The Las Palmas Branch Library project will provide additional improvements to the branch library portion of the building. These branch library improvements would be in alignment with the design vision of the Westside Strategic Area Development Project. The Library portion of scope is estimated to cost \$2,500,000.
