City Manager Erik Walsh provided an overview of the Item. He showed a chart with the historical background related to more than 330,000 migrants traveling through San Antonio since January 2021 as San Antonio was the nearest transportation hub for border cities and Federal Detention Facilities. City Manager Walsh provided a breakdown of the countries represented since July 2022 when the Migrant Resource Center Centro de Bienvenida opened July 7, 2022 which served 92,000 asylum seekers.

According to City Manager Walsh, Catholic Charities began daily operations of the site on October 1, 2022 with coordination by the City of San Antonio Department of Human Services related to building maintenance, transportation and partner coordination. City Manager Walsh stated that the City was seeking reimbursement for services provided by the City and provided a historical accounting of the reimbursement submitted since January 2021 through September 2022 which totaled \$8,461,278.

City Manager Walsh thanked the Department of Human Services, the San Antonio Police Department and the San Antonio Fire Department for their work on the Migrant Resource Center.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Hernando Arce, Daniel Beckworth, Celeste Sparks, Jason Pena, Andrew Vicencio, Jack Finger, and Jon Melendez spoke in opposition to the Item.

DISCUSSION:

Councilmember Pelaez requested clarification that the Item on the agenda was for reimbursement of money already spent. City Manager Walsh stated that the Item was to request funding for the future period of January through March 2023 and noted that no profit

was made from operating the Center.

Councilmember McKee-Rodriguez commented that reimbursement was necessary for the City to continue serving the migrants passing through our community and asked if there were fire sprinklers and fire extinguishers on site. Assistant City Manager Lori Houston stated that the facility was fully sprinkled, noted that the facility had a capacity of 718 occupants and if the amount exceded that, SAFD began a fire watch which allowed a capacity of up to 850 residents.

Councilmember McKee-Rodriguez asked what would happen if the City did not seek reimbursement or discontinued to operate the Center. City Manager Walsh stated that in either case, the City would not get paid but the migrants would still come and transit through San Antonio. Councilmember McKee-Rodriguez noted that if the City did not operate the Center the migrants would be disbursed throughout the community. City Manager Walsh clarified that the goal was to facilitate travel through San Antonio in an orderly fashion.

Councilmember Rocha Garcia asked about the amount of SAPD patrol and security at the facility and whether those costs were being reimbursed. Deputy City Manager Maria Villagomez replied that SAPD Officers were assigned to the Center and there was increased patrol in the area and the Federal Government was reimbursing for the costs. Councilmember Rocha Garcia asked who provided the food for the migrants. Deputy City Manager Villagomez confirmed that the San Antonio Food Bank provided meals under contract with Catholic Charities.

Councilmember Rocha Garcia asked about the length of the lease and how many other cities had Centers. Assistant City Manager Houston stated that the lease was for 10 years with a 30 day notice to terminate the lease and only El Paso had this type of facility. Councilmember Rocha Garcia suggested that comprehensive immigration reform should be on the City's Legislative Agenda. City Manager Walsh and City Attorney Andy Segovia stated that the legislative agenda would be discussed at a later date.

Councilmember Viagran commented that refugees crossing the border were not going to stop until there was comprehensive immigration reform. Councilmember Viagran commended the work of Catholic Charities and supported getting reimbursed from the Federal Government for both the City and its partners. She expressed concern about people hanging out in the airport as well as local individuals that had taken advantage of vulnerable immigrant populations including children. Councilmember Viagran suggested more metrics on the outcomes for those migrants.

Councilmember Bravo stated that he had visited the Center unannounced and noted that SAPD stopped him but he was able to get in after making some calls which proved security was good. He reported that the Center was safe and clean and noted that the migrant surge was not created by the City and commended staff for making the process less disruptive for residents and businesses.

Councilmember Bravo asked whether there was a financial penalty for ending the lease early. Assistant City Manager Houston stated that only a 30 day notice was required. Councilmember

Bravo noted that if the Center were to be closed then the migrants would be sleeping on the streets so the program was the most compassionate.

Mayor Nirenberg closed the discussion by supporting the Center and the reimbursement.

City Manager's Report

57. Fiscal Year 2022 Preliminary Year-End Financial Report [María Villagómez, Deputy City Manager]

City Manager Erik Walsh introduced the Director of the Office of Management and Budget Justina Tate who provided the 2022 Year End Financial Report on the General Fund which had a \$14.2 million positive variance, Airport Fund which had a \$4.8 million positive variance, Development Services Fund which had a \$1.3 million positive variance and Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund which had a \$4.3 million positive variance. Tate stated that an update on the FY 2023 Budget would be provided to City Council in February 2023.

City Manager Walsh recognized the Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion for receiving a perfect score on the Municipal Equity Index.

City Manager Walsh played an Employee Spotlight Video highlighting two employees who transitioned from civilian service to the San Antonio Fire Department: Gilbert Ortiz and Aaron Perez.
