

**ORDINANCE**

**APPROVING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO'S FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE  
PROGRAM FOR THE 118<sup>TH</sup> U.S. CONGRESS.**

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**WHEREAS**, development of the City's Federal Legislative Program began in July 2022 with the collaboration of City departments and our Federal consultant team; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed Program priorities, drawn from the City of San Antonio's strategic plans previously adopted by the City Council, is designed to be strategic and impactful, align with the priorities of the San Antonio community, and help advance a resilient and sustainable city infrastructure; and

**WHEREAS**, for the 118<sup>th</sup> U.S. Congress, which convened on January 10, 2023, the City's Federal priorities consist of seven pillars, which include Infrastructure, Resiliency & Transportation, Housing, Workforce and Training, Public Health and Human Services, Economic and Community Development, Military Protection, and Public Safety; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 28, 2022, the City Council Intergovernmental Relations Committee voted to forward the Program to the full City Council at a B Session which was held on January 11, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, it is now necessary for the full City Council to approve the City of San Antonio's Federal Legislative Program for the 118<sup>th</sup> U.S. Congress; **NOW, THEREFORE:**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:**

**SECTION 1.** The City of San Antonio's Federal Legislative Program for the 118<sup>th</sup> U.S. Congress is authorized and approved. A copy of the Program is attached to this Ordinance as **Exhibit I**.

**SECTION 2.** The Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective 10 days after passage.
