


## Purpose

This ordinance authorizes the acceptance of funds from the Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council for Trauma (STRAC) up to the amount of\$713,609 and appropriates funds for two first responder programs:

- Polysubstance Overdose Prevention Crisis Response
- Program for Intensive Care Coordination (PICC)



## Background - Poly-OPCR

New Program funded by STRAC to address substance use disorders by offering services to people living in San Antonio at risk of overdose from opioids, alcohol, cocaine, methamphetamine, or other poly-substances. Patient are identified through:

- Post overdose 911 calls
- Internal referrals from EMS/Fire crews
- External referrals from existing partners (Haven for Hope, SACADA, etc.)

## Background - PICC

In 2019, STRAC received funding for a 6-month pilot program to reduce the number of high-volume emergency detentions to local hospitals.

Due to its success, additional funding has been provided in 2020, 2021, 2022, and now again in 2023.

The PICC program uses two SAFD Mobile Integrated Health units along with two SAPD Mental Health Unit officers and the Center Health Care Services to connect with high-volume utilizers during pre and post mental health crisis.

Recommendations

Staff recommends approval of this ordinance to accept the donation of \$713,609 from the Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council for Trauma (STRAC)
