## <u>Issue Proposed for Consideration</u>

I request your support for the inclusion of the following item on the agenda of the earliest available meeting of the Governance Committee and subsequent approval by the full City Council:

Direction to City staff to draft an ordinance to require that all places of public accommodation display in bathrooms clearly visible signage featuring domestic violence and sex trafficking prevention resources.

## **Brief Background**

As a community, we must take every opportunity to saturate messaging regarding domestic violence and sex trafficking prevention in order to increase community awareness and vigilance about this critical issue and ensure that those in need have access to support resources.

Places of accommodation that would be required to post signage include but are not limited to:

- All City Facilities
- Gyms
- Restaurants
- Bars
- Hair Salons
- Nail Salons
- Hotels
- Convenience Stores
- Laundromats
- Food Markets
- The San Antonio Airport
