Background



- On June 22, 2017, City Council passed a resolution in support of the Paris Climate Agreement; directing city staff to develop a plan to help San Antonio meet the objectives of this agreement.
- On October 17, 2019, City Council adopted the SA Climate Ready Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP).
- To effectively implement the CAAP, the plan called for two externally-recruited committees: a Technical and Community Advisory Committee and a Climate Equity Advisory Committee.
- On October 8, 2020, City Council approved the full slate of recommended candidates for the Technical & Community Advisory Committee and the Climate Equity Advisory Committee.
- The Energy Industry representative resigned from the Technical and Community Advisory Committee.

Committee Details



Technical & Community Advisory Committee

- 17 at-large members, 5 organizational members, 1 research collaborator, and the Chair or Vice-Chair of the Climate Equity Committee.
- The Committee is designed to provide expertise, diverse perspectives, and input regarding implementation of the CAAP as the City works to achieve greenhouse gas reduction and adaptation goals.
- Mission: Advise City staff and City Council on the advancement and equity-centered implementation of the SA Climate Ready Plan, as well as related long-term sustainability plans, such as the SA Tomorrow Sustainability Plan.

Climate Equity Advisory Committee

- 10 at-large representatives from community-based organizations and other key stakeholders representing
 the interests of low-income populations, communities of color, and marginalized populations, and the
 Chair or Vice-Chair of the Technical and Community Advisory Committee.
- Mission: provide input on the implementation of the CAAP to ensure an equity-centered approach and equitable outcomes.

Selection Process



- A call for applications was released on September 14, 2021.
- Two applications were received for the energy industry vacancy.
- A CHECC subcommittee consisting of Councilwoman Sandoval and Councilman Bravo, with support from the Office of Sustainability and the Office of Equity, Diversity and Inclusion, interviewed both applicants on October 29, 2021.
- The subcommittee selected Mr. David Walter, Vice President of Business Development for NuStar Energy as the preferred candidate.

Recommendation



Staff recommends approval of Mr. David Walter as the energy industry representative for the SA Climate Ready Technical and Community Advisory Committee and for the committee to refer Mr. Walter to the full City
