disciplined Accepts or Referral to IA ✓ Discipline must take place within 180 days of incident unless Officer is indicted

CARB Roles & Responsibilities

- Hears investigations completed by Internal Affairs on complaints against police officers
- All members of the CARB shall be given opportunity to review each case that will be presented
- CARB may elect to hear testimony from complainants or responding officers. Testimony is voluntary

CARB Roles & Responsibilities

- Each portion of the Board makes independent disciplinary recommendations
- All members have a duty to maintain the confidentiality of privileged information

Composition of the CARB

Police Portion

- Consists of seven (7) voting members:
 - 1 Deputy Chief who shall serve as chairperson
 - 1 Captain
 - 1 Lieutenant
 - 1 Sergeant
 - 1Detective Investigator
 - 2 Patrol Officers
- Members are appointed by the Chief and serve for 180 calendar days

Composition of the CARB

Community Portion

- Consists 7 appointees selected from a panel of 14 available members appointed
- The appointees serve a twoyear term, in 6-month increments
- During that term, the appointees hear cases for 6months then rotates out for 6months

Qualifications & Requirements

- Completion and submission of application to City Clerk's Office
- Must be resident of San Antonio for two years
- Cannot be indicted for a felony or crime of moral turpitude
- Cannot be officially charged with a Class A or B misdemeanor

Civilian Appointment Process

Interview Panel

- Deputy City
 Manager
- Chief of Police
- City Attorney
- Internal Affairs

Notification to SAPOA

- City sends letter to SAPOA
- SAPOA has opportunity to provide feedback prior to City Council consideration

Council Appointment

- Appointment made by City Council
- Two-Year appointment

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
