Background

On June 17, 2021, City Council Action:

Authorized acceptance of the CDC COVID-19 Health Disparities grant funds in the amount of \$26,596,171 and authorized certain agreements funded by the grant

Authorized certain agreements related to the City's Health Implementation Plan

Today's Action

Approves a personnel complement of 21 full-time positions funded by the COVID-19 Health Disparities grant

Amends agreement with the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston for COVID-19 case investigation and contact tracing to extend the term and increase value

Amends agreement with the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio for COVID-19 variant testing to increase value Initial personnel complement for the CDC COVID-19 Health Disparities Grant

21 Positions

- Support the Strategic Growth
 Plan
- Work to address Adverse
 Childhood Experiences (ACEs),
 provide violence prevention case management services, diabetes self-management and nutrition education
- Establish Metro Health's Office of Policy and Civic Engagement and the Access to Care section
- Operational support

Ratification of Contract Amendments

- University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston for COVID-19 case investigation and contact tracing services
 - Extends the term to end March 31, 2022
 - Adds funds for a total amount up to \$10,620,704
- University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio for COVID-19 variant testing
 - Adds funds for a total amount up to \$558,912 for term ending March 30,2022
- Due to continued COVID-19 public health emergency, amendments were executed in September and October



Fiscal Impact

- Funding for the 21 full-time positions for the CDC Health Disparities grant is budgeted in the Health Disparities grant fund. There is no impact to the General Fund.
- Funding for the amendment with UTHSC at Houston in the amount of \$3,220,704, increasing the cumulative amount of the contract to \$10,620,704 for term ending March 31, 2022 is budgeted in the Health Disparities Grant Fund and the Health Implementation Plan Budget.
- Funding for the amendment with UTHSC at San Antonio in the amount of \$358,912, increasing the cumulative amount of the contract to \$558,912 for term ending March 30, 2022 is budgeted in the Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity for Infectious Diseases (ELC) Grant Fund.

Today's Action

Authorizes acceptance of funds from the CDC for the Community Health Workers (CHW) for COVID Response and Resilient Communities grant in the amount up to \$2.4M for a period ending August 30, 2022

Authorizes a personnel complement of 9 full-time positions



Train CHWs with the knowledge, roles, and skills to support the COVID-19 public health response to manage outbreaks and prevent community spread.





Engage CHWs to help build and strengthen community resilience to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 by improving the overall health of priority populations in communities.

Today's Action

Authorizes negotiation and execution of agreements related to the COVID-19 CHW grant deliverables

\$240K	UTHSCSA Institute for Health Promotion Research for program evaluation services
\$433K	UTHSCSA Community Health Clubs
\$43K	ACCD Northwest Vista College to support formal Community Health Worker training and certification
\$300K	San Antonio Area Foundation to administer mini grants for community-based organizations to deploy CHWs

Fiscal Impact

- Acceptance of funds from the CDC through CARES Act funding for the Community Health Workers for COVID Response and Resilient Communities Grant is for an amount up to \$2.4M for the period August 31, 2021-August 30, 2022.
- The authorization of a personnel complement is for 9 full-time positions.
- There is no impact on the General Fund in the form of a cash match.
- Funding for the agreements related to the grant deliverables is budgeted in the COVID-19 CHW grant fund.
