<p>What approach would you take? Who would you work with? Why this particular issue?</p>	<p>Despite anyone's circumstances, mental health related issues can devastate an individual's life. Mental health issues can come from genetic and environmental reasons and are a crisis particularly among youth. In particular, LGBTQ youth are disproportionately affected by mental health issues and are four times more likely to attempt suicide than non-LGBTQ youth. The best way to help youth get the help they need is to educate them. When you are struggling, the hardest thing to do can be to ask for help. But sometimes to get the help you need, you don't even need to ask. Free online resources are available to help youth and others with mental health related issues. Resources like the Crisis Text Line or The Trevor Project are available, but many youth don't know they are there. Just knowing about these resources could provide so many youth with the ability to get the help they deserve and need. My goal would be to work with both administrations, school boards, teachers, and students to implement knowledge of these resources and other mental health information into schools across the city. Ways to do this could include adding to health classes or having student leaders provide information. This particular issue hits close to home for me and many other LGBTQ youth. Struggling with identity and self-view can lead to much worse problems as time goes on. No one should be prevented from getting help because they couldn't ask, and that is why it is so important to share information about resources with youth so they can get the help they need.</p>
