Hazard Mitigation Plan

- Required by Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)
- Needed to qualify for pre-disaster and post-disaster federal funding for mitigation purposes
- Must be updated every five years
- Plan has been adopted by the City Council and has been approved by the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) and FEMA
- Plan is valid through November 9, 2026

Background

City Council adopted the Hazard Mitigation Plan on October 21, 2021 and requested an amendment be completed to include:

- A review of the winter weather hazard profile
- A review of the current hazard risk ranking
- The integration of climate change and how it impacts our hazard profiles
- Implementation of strategies for ongoing public engagement
- Overall plan reformatting and pagination to improve layout and navigation

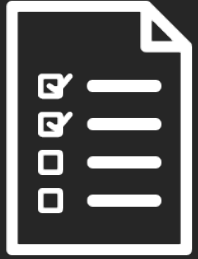
