ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A FUNDING AGREEMENT BETWEEN SAN ANTONIO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO IN THE AMOUNT OF \$42,064.00 FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF THESE FUNDS FROM SAN ANTONIO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THEIR SHARE OF CONSTRUCTION-RELATED EXPENSES FOR THE INSTALLATION OF TWO ADVANCED WARNING SCHOOL FLASHING BEACONS NEAR G.W. BRACKENRIDGE HIGH SCHOOL LOCATED IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 1; AND AUTHORIZING THE AMENDMENT OF THE FY2022-FY2027 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM WITH THESE FUNDS FROM SAN ANTONIO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT TO THE FY2022 SCHOOL PEDESTRIAN SAFETY PROJECT.

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WHEREAS, since October 2008, the City of San Antonio (“City”) has offered the School Flasher Beacon Cost Share Program funded through the City’s School Pedestrian Safety Improvement Program whereby schools, interested in installing or enhancing existing flashing warning beacons, are eligible to receive a 50% match of actual cost from the City up to \$50,000.00; and

WHEREAS, San Antonio Independent School District (“SAISD”) has submitted a written request to participate in the School Flashing Beacon Cost Share Program for the G.W. Brackenridge High School, a Texas public school, located at 400 Eagleland Drive between South St. Mary’s Street and East Guenther Street in Council District 1; and

WHEREAS, the estimated total cost for the installation of the warning flashing beacons is \$84,128.00. SAISD will fund 50% of the total amount, estimated at \$42,064.00 and City will fund the remaining 50% of the total estimated amount up to \$42,064.00. Should the total project cost exceed the City’s estimate, SAISD will contribute 50% of the funds required for completion of the project with the City providing the remaining 50% of the actual cost; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance authorizes the execution of a Funding Agreement between the City and SAISD and accepts up to 50% of the cost, or \$42,064.00 for construction-related expenses for the installation of two (2) advanced warning flashing beacons near the G.W. Brackenridge High School; and

WHEREAS, a traffic engineering study and evaluation, completed by the Department of Public Works in response to the submitted written request for the School Flashing Beacon Cost Share Program, supports the installation of two (2) advanced warning flashing beacons near G.W.

Brackenridge High School to help draw motorist attention to the existing school warning signs;
NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager, his designee, or the Director of Public Works is hereby authorized to execute a Funding Agreement between the City of San Antonio and San Antonio Independent School District in the amount of \$42,064.00 for their share of construction-related expenses for the installation of two (2) advanced warning flashing beacons near G.W. Brackenridge High School located in Council District 1 for the FY 2022 School Pedestrian Safety Project. A copy of the Agreement in substantially final form is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Exhibit I**.

SECTION 2. Further, this ordinance amends the FY 2022 – FY 2027 Capital Improvement Program with funds in the amount of \$42,064.00 from the San Antonio Independent School District to the FY 2022 School Pedestrian Safety Project.

SECTION 3. Funds are authorized to be received from San Antonio Independent School District to SAP Fund 45099000, General Obligation Capital Projects, Project Definition 23-03834, 2022 School Pedestrian Safety, and the budget shall be revised by increasing WBS element 23-03834-90-10-01 SAISD Contribution with GL account 4502280 and WBS 23-03834-03-02 with GL account 5201140, each by the amount of \$42,064.00.

Section 4: The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, City of San Antonio. The Deputy Chief Financial Officer may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific Fund Numbers, Project Definitions, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, Fund Centers, Cost Centers, Functional Areas, Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.
